From The Archives, 9 Years Ago

Midland Football League Division One - Tuesday 23rd August 2016 - 7:45 p.m. kick-off

Bromsgrove Sporting 3 (2) Hinckley AFC 0 (0)

Bromsgrove Sporting continued their flawless start to the Midland Football League Division One, as they beat Hinckley AFC 3-0 at the Victoria Ground on Tuesday evening.

A sweetly struck Keenen Meakin-Richards free kick helped put Sporting on the road to victory before a brace of Ahmed Ali headers allowed them to ease to their third league win in as many games.

Both came courtesy of pinpoint Jack Wilson crosses, with the first being glanced across the six-yard box and into the bottom corner and the second an emphatically thumped effort that left Hinckley keeper Haydn Whitcombe helpless.

The evening did not get off to the best of starts for the influential Ali, as his misplaced back-pass gave Sam Agar a glorious chance of giving the visitors the lead. However, the Hinckley forward found his one on one effort expertly saved by the assured Chris Jay.

The opener came seventeen minutes into proceedings after Tony Clarke was upended twenty-five yards out. The resultant free kick was beautifully guided into the net by Meakin-Richards.

The Rouslers could have doubled their lead only a minute after the goal, with Robbie Bunn's firmly hit twenty-yard strike well saved by Whitcombe.

Ali's impact was shown to good effect on the half hour mark, as his header found Tony Clarke, whose lobbed effort ultimately landed well wide of the post.

The two goal cushion came seven minutes from the half time whistle, as Wilson's enticing cross into the box found the head of Ali, who nonchalantly nodded home, much to the elation of the Sporting faithful. Hinckley almost pulled one back not long after, as Agar attempted to lob keeper Jay, who ultimately watched the ball land on top of the net.

Substitute Will Tibbetts hit the ground running as soon as he came on, with his cross on 60 minutes finding Chris Lloyd, whose volleyed shot was kept out by Whitcombe.

Hinckley had chances to get on to the scoresheet but were wasteful with the opportunities that came their way. Former Sporting player Darious Darkin's shot from inside the area sailed over the bar before an Isaac Cooper cross failed to find a visiting attacker, instead being palmed clear by Jay.

Sporting's third saw the potent combination of Wilson and Ali team up once again, as Wilson's cross from the left wing found Ali perfectly, who simply had to confidently head home to seal all three points for Paul Smith's side. Bunn had a chance to add a fourth after being cleverly set up by Clarke but his shot was quickly blocked by a Hinckley defender.

Another consummate victory from Bromsgrove, who put their FA Cup exit on Saturday firmly behind them, retaining their top of the league status and 100% clean sheet league record in the process.

Reflecting on his match winning performance, Ali said: "To be fair, I didn't start too good today. I gave away an early chance but yeah, two goals is good."

"But we've got to work together, only three games in, 35 to go. We know if we don't play well then we can get beat."

"I'm new to the team and the gaffer has told us we're challenging for the title as long as we keep going." The Non-League Paper provides a column for club programmes each week. This week's contribution is from Jon Couch.

PRECISELY 104 days after Aldershot Town and Whitstable Town lifted the Isuzu FA Trophy and FA Vase respectively at a sun-

drenched Wembley Stadium, Non-League's two premier cup competitions are back for another eagerly-awaited campaign. This afternoon, the 2025-26 FA Trophy kicks off with 32 clubs from Step 4 contesting 16 preliminary round ties.

A record 336 entrants begin the 12-round Road to Wembley and perhaps slightly unfortunate to be made to qualify is Grays Athletic, who have a proud FA Trophy history having won the second of two consecutive finals 20 years ago with victory over Woking, a year after beating Hucknall Town on penalties.

They make the trip this afternoon to Eastern Counties League Premier champions Brantham Athletic, one of four clubs making their FA Trophy debuts.

Rugby Borough, Hassocks FC and last season's FA Vase runners-up, AFC Whyteleafe, are the others with their sights set on a potentially lucrative run into the latter stages and the visit of a National League big gun.

In this week's NLP, our friends at @ Non-League Factfile were back with all the facts and figures ahead of this afternoon's ties – and once again there was plenty to mull over.

Four clubs are looking to equal their best FA Trophy run with victory in this preliminary round, namely Garforth Town, Wellingborough Town, Gorleston FC and Westbury United, while ten ties involve clubs that will meet each other in league games this season

And there's plenty of scores to settle on the field too with three of the 16 ties involving clubs that have met in the FA Trophy before

Three years ago, Hanworth Villa beat Northwood 3-0 and Bashley defeated Frome Town 4-1, both in the first qualifying round. Margate knocked out Egham Town in the second qualifying round eight years ago.

The Isuzu FA Vase is equally as fascinating with no fewer than 623 having entered – the highest tally for six years.

This weekend, 202 first qualifying round ties take place up and down the country, involving 404 clubs from Steps 5 and 6. Seven former FA Vase winners are in action: Whitley Bay (four times, 2001-02, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11), Brigg Town (1995-96, 2002-03), Romford FC (2023-24), Thatcham Town (2018), Diss Town (1994), Stansted FC (1984) and Hoddesdon Town, the first club to lift the Vase at Wembley Stadium in 1974-75.

In contrast, 26 clubs are participating in the FA Vase for the first time with four more entering in the next round, on September 6. The tie between Grangetown Boys Club and Leeds Ultra Football Academy guarantees there will be at least five debut clubs in the next round.

Step 6 clubs have enjoyed solid Vase campaigns in recent years and this first qualifying round draw ensured that 61 tenth-tier clubs will progress to the next round (plus Boldon Community Association who have a walkover).

At least 44 Step 5 clubs will exit in this round with a possibility of an upset in 97 ties.

Thirteen clubs will be looking to make history by tasting Vase victory for the first time, while Newcastle Blue Star, Shirehampton FC and Horbury Town are all looking for a first win at their third attempt.

The tie between Club Thorne Colliery and Horbury Town is the only tie to guarantee a club making second qualifying round tie for the first time, while three other ties will see the winners at least equal their best Vase run - Retford FC versus Appleby Frodingham, AFC Aldermaston v Bristol Telephones and St Day v Stoke Gabriel and Torbay Police.

Twenty-three ties involve clubs that have met in FA Vase before, but Stafford Town v Tividale FC is the only one to have occurred more than once before. They have one win apiece in their past Vase meetings.

And talking of grudge matches, Southern Combination side Pagham FC have had to wait 49 years for the opportunity to avenge a 7-0 defeat by Newport (IOW) – the longest of any side in the competition.

So, the first of ten rounds on the Road to Wembley starts here with the four Finals Day contenders contesting Non-League's most prestigious prizes under the arch on Sunday May 17, 2026.

It's an occasion to savour and a fitting finale to two much-loved competitions which grow in stature year on year.

Start your engines, it promises to be a bumpy ride.

How Did the Beautiful Game get so Ugly?

As football has come to dominate global culture, it has fallen prey to venal politics and the mindless pursuit of growth

Book review by Rory Smith of The Observer.

Looking back, it has the quality of madness. In the unseasonably warm and unimaginably chilling spring of 2020, with the country and the planet in the teeth of that first, savage bite of the pandemic, the amount of time dedicated and energy expended in ensuring that football could resume as quickly as possible might charitably be described as excessive.

Given how hostile and alien the world felt at that point, maybe we could be forgiven for failing to grasp quite how extreme were the measures put in place to restore the game to our television screens. At five years' remove, in the megawatt beam of hindsight, it is possible to see more clearly.

It is hard to say which element of lockdown football was most extraordinary. The substitutes wearing N95 respirator masks, maybe? The edict that actually banned hugging? The fact that someone came up with the concept of allowing players to train "while maintaining social distancing" and nobody pointed out the absurdity of it? David Goldblatt, the sport's academic historian of choice, offers a less obvious but equally convincing contender: the dedication with which engineers at various TV networks attempted to perfect the artificial crowd noise that provided an uncanny broadcast soundtrack to matches held in silent stadiums. By the time fans were starting to appear in stands once more, he writes, they could "vary the intensity and length" of each sound effect so that a "last-minute missed equaliser" sounded different to a "half-chance in the first 15 minutes". Given how much time, thought and technical expertise would have been required to achieve this; it is easy to think it was all a lot of effort for what is, deep down, just a game.

Except, of course, it isn't just a game. That is why Boris Johnson, then prime minister, could insist that the return of the Premier League would be good for the nation's morale; it is why, while football was an afterthought during both world wars, when a national emergency struck in 2020, 'such was the game's popularity, power and financial heft' that the government 'went out of its way to ensure its continuation'.

It is hard to overstate the role football plays in modern culture. Both Goldblatt and the historian Tom Holland - it is not clear who said it first, so let's credit them both - have described football fandom in the 21st century as the most widely practised pastime in the history of humankind; it is not, in all likelihood, an exaggeration. That sentiment is perhaps better understood on a more personal scale: as the *Athletic*'s Jack Pitt-Brooke noted on an episode of the *Libero* podcast, football is now a cultural form that one must opt out of, rather than into. Certainly among men, those who do not care for it often actively declare their lack of allegiance; liking football is almost, now, seen as the default position.

Last month, across the BBC and ITV, some 16.2 million people watched England beat Spain to retain the Women's European Championship. No television event this year will come close to those figures. More people in the UK watched the broadcast of the final of Euro 2020 - in which England's men lost to Italy - than the wedding of Charles and Diana (31 million compared with 28 million), despite the fact the distractions of Netflix and YouTube did not exist in 1981. Football, almost alone, stands exempt from the breakdown of communal consumption that has afflicted almost every other part of the media landscape.

The thesis Goldblatt unspools in *Injury Time* is therefore a convincing one: football, as the dominant cultural form in modern Britain, has not only become the "central metaphorical space" in which the country addresses itself, but it has also come to provide a perfect reflective surface. It is in the game, he believes, that we might most clearly see ourselves.

This approach is not new; a whole canon of football literature has emerged in the last few decades that springs from the same realisation. Most of the world's major footballing nations have been explored through the lens of their football cultures. Franklin Foer and Simon Kuper are among those writers who have used football to explain the whole planet. Most of the time - if not quite all - the basic idea holds up. Goldblatt's twist, however, is that his mirror is distorting, the reflection unflattering - a portrait in the attic. His assessment of the state of football's soul, and by extension, Britain's, falls somewhere between sombre and downright grim: the game, as he depicts it, is unable to rid itself of racism, hooked on get-rich-quick schemes and willing to sell anything and everything for the right price to the wrong buyer.

It is, in truth, impossible to defend football against the majority of charges levelled by Goldblatt. Too often the sport's attempts to deal with prejudice border on tokenism. Its governing bodies have, frequently, been too venal and craven to protect what is, in effect, a mass social institution. It has too willingly embraced the idea of eternal growth for its own sake - what the author Jasper Fforde once described as "the philosophy of cancer" - regardless of either the source of the money or the cost attached.

And yet the picture is a little more complex than it first appears. The other major event in football's summer - along with the glorious, uplifting coda provided by the Lionesses - was the inaugural FIFA Club World Cup, an ersatz tournament that, at times, seemed largely to exist so that the body's oleaginous president, Gianni Infantino, might ingratiate himself with Donald Trump.

But that was not quite the extent of its purpose. Football, in its modern state, is caught between the competing interests of two distinct factions. On one side are the private equity investors, the mainly American finance houses that have descended on the game with the aim of squeezing every last drop of money from its pores. On the other are the nation states - Qatar, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, in particular - who have been drawn to the sport, like moths to the very brightest of flames, because of the unparalleled soft power it offers. The Club World Cup was where the two sides met: a tournament designed to swell the coffers of a handful of teams by packing an already overstuffed calendar yet tighter, bankrolled (indirectly) by Saudi money, embedding the kingdom as the game's financial engine.

Football has, in effect, outgrown itself; increasingly, the game - its clubs, its competitions, its organisers, and its executives, all of them its theoretical guardians - is at the mercy of forces it cannot resist. It has grown so large, so fat and so influential that even as a pandemic raged it became a matter of national importance that games should be played. Goldblatt concludes his dissection of football's rottenness by examining the sport's refusal to confront the climate crisis. It is a pressing issue, without question, but also provides the perfect symbol of where the game finds itself in 2025: swept inexorably along to a disaster of its own making, buffeted on all sides by powers now beyond its control.



Founded in 1919, one of the club's most notable early successes came in the form of Suffolk



& Ipswich Football League Senior Division Champions in 1995/96, before earning promotion as runners up from the Eastern Counties First Division in 2004/05. The Marketmen's maiden season in the Eastern Counties Premier Division also proved to be successful, finishing in 6th place. The club then won its first ever FA Cup tie in a home win over Desborough Town in 2006/07, before going on to finish fourth in the Eastern Counties Premier division and beating Concord Rangers 2-1 to win the East Anglian Cup.

The club then finished runners up in the league the following season, while also making the semi-finals of the FA Vase and bowing out to eventual winners Kirkham & Wesham, and winning the League Challenge Cup in the same season. The club then finished 3rd in the Eastern Counties Premier Division in 2008/09, before reaching the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase in 2008/09.

The following season saw the club achieve a league and cup double for the first time in the league's previous 15 seasons after being crowned Eastern Counties Premier Division Champions and League Challenge Cup winners. Step 4 football followed in 2010/11, with the club proudly finishing 2nd in their maiden season in the Isthmian League Division One North before losing to Brentwood Town in the semi-finals. The club again achieved a playoff spot in 2011/12, but lost to Enfield Town in the play-off final following a 4th place finish, scoring 104 goals along the way.

The club then reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 2013/14, which drew the club's record attendance to Bloomfields as 1,784 spectators witnessed a 1-0 defeat to higher league Cambridge United, while the club again reached the play-off semi-finals in the Isthmian North Division after a 5th place finish.

The club then won promotion to step 3 for the first time in 2014/15 as Isthmian League North Division Champions, securing promotion to the Isthmian Premier Division. A 20th placed finish was followed by a 9th placed finish in the club's first two seasons in the division before being moved sideways into the Southern League Central Division in 2018/19 when the club finished 11th.

The club however sat second and unbeaten after 7 games, in the table when the 2020/21 season was declared null and void, while also reaching the Second Round Proper of the FA Trophy for the first time that same season, losing out 4-2 to National League North leaders Gloucester City.

Kevin Horlock's side then extended their record FA Trophy run to the Quarter-Finals in 2021/22, knocking out St Ives Town 2-0 away, Margate 3-2 at home, Welwyn Garden City 3-1 at home, National League Wealdstone 2-1 at home, National League side Yeovil Town away 8-7 on penalties, in arguably one of the most memorable games of the club's history, following a 1-1 draw, and National League South side Dartford 1-0 at home, before bowing out to National League Champions Stockport County 3-0 at home. A 12th place league finish followed, while the 2022/23 season saw the club finish 17th in the league despite reaching the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time in the club's history following a 1-0 home victory over National League side Maidstone United in the 4th Qualifying Round, with a valiant performance despite a 2-0 defeat at EFL League One side Burton Albion.

The club then became only the second Suffolk Non-League team ever to get promoted to step 2 in the 2023/24 season, as part of a historic double, as Southern League Central Premier Division Champions - going unbeaten at home before sealing the league title, scoring 74 goals across the league campaign, keeping 21 cleans sheets. The Marketmen also went close to matching the previous season's FA Cup run, falling short in the last minute to York City in the 4th Qualifying Round Replay, before retaining the Suffolk Premier Cup for the fourth successive season in April.

Last (2024/25) season however saw the Marketmen relegated (21st) in their inaugural step 2 season, but did however record notable wins over Hereford, Chorley and Alfreton picking up 22 points from 46 games in the Vanarama National League North, with Tom Rothery replacing Kevin Horlock as manager in February 2025.

Tom took over as Manager following the resignation of Kevin Horlock in early February, after playing an important part as Assistant Manager in the club's recent record runs in the FA Trophy (Quarter-Finals), FA Cup

(1st Round Proper), League title win and Suffolk Premier Cup triumphs, since returning to the club in October 2019. Tom's eye for detail is second to none, as well as having in-depth knowledge of the non-league scene.

Nathan Munson MBE - Assistant Manager

Previous clubs: Colchester United, Wivenhoe Town, Billericay Town, AFC Sudbury, Leiston, Harwich & Parkeston, Stanway Rovers, Brantham Athletic, Stowmarket Town

'Munno' was a professional at Colchester United in the early 90's before moving into non-league football, and is no stranger to Needham having previously been at the club between 2013-22, during which time the club won promotion to step 3, before serving as Joint Assistant Manager from 2019 until spending a couple of seasons away, returning in November 2023, recently reprising his role as Assistant Manager. He has also represented the English and British Police sides.

Patrick Brothers - Head Coach

Previous clubs: Colchester United, Leiston, Brantham Athletic

'Patch' joined the club in Mid-January 2022 as a midfielder and has since become an invaluable part of the management team, playing a crucial part in last season's league title win, having assisted as First Team Coach while recovering from injuries last season.

Darren Oxbrow - Kit Manager

Darren joined the club in the summer, boosting the management team with his experience as a former professional footballer at clubs such as Ipswich Town and Colchester United and also taking on vital responsibilities behind the scenes as Kit Manager.

James Lambert - Physio

James joined the club in February from Woodbridge Town as a qualified physiotherapist with his calm and reassured approach making him a key part of the team.

James Bradbrook - Goalkeeper

Previous clubs: Bury Town, Stowmarket Town, AFC Sudbury, Brightlingsea Regent

Bradders re-joined the Marketmen in the summer, having previously progressed through the Academy, before making a name for himself as one of the best 'keepers in the area at Stowmarket Town, after working with current manager Tom Rothery at Brightlingsea, helping them to a club historic promotion to step 4 in 2021. Bradders has since played a key part in Sudbury surviving relegation at step 3 in both of the last two seasons.

Jake Dye - Defence

Jake was one of the first few to progress through the very successful Needham Market Academy, into the First Team, surpassing 400 appearances last season, while only being in his mid 20's. A natural defender, Jake works hard to improve his game every season and has added goals to his repertoire and has a very bright future ahead of him, winning three club awards at the end of the 2022/23 season, to demonstrate his continuing growth in the game.

Tommy Smith - Defence

Previous clubs: Ipswich Town, Bury Town Stowmarket Town

Tommy was at Ipswich Town from the age of 9 up until 21, signing his first professional contract in February 2020. A full-back with a lot of potential, Tommy is a key figure at both ends of the pitch and has been virtually ever present since signing in summer 2023.

Kyle Hammond - Defence / Midfield

Previous clubs: Ipswich Town, Maldon & Tiptree, Leiston

Kyle, formerly of Ipswich Town, joined the club in June 2021 and quickly established himself as a key figure in midfield, and has also rarely missed a match since signing. Kyle, who can also play in defence, notably won the club's 'Goal Of The Season Award' for the 2023-24 season and scored the club's first ever goal at step 2 last season.

Keiran Morphew - Defence

The first Needham player to progress through the club's Academy, and is currently the club's second longest serving player and club captain. Keiran, who chipped in with a handful of league goals last season - including a brace v South Shields, is rapidly approaching 500 club appearances, and has been a key feature in the Marketmen's defence over the last decade, having been one of three current players who were part of the squad

that earned promotion to step 3 in 2015. Into his fifth season as captain, he has also been instrumental in the club's impressive defensive record, which even included having one of the best defensive records in the league over the previous two step 3 seasons, notably making the National League North team of the week last season after scoring twice v South Shields. No relation to Dan.

Daniel Morphew - Defence/Midfield

Dr. Dan Morphew, having completed his Doctorate, is the club's vice-captain. With over 300 club appearances, Dan is a no nonsense defender, and is elegant on the ball, yet rugged in the tackle. Dan is also a threat at set pieces having scored 15 goals in his first two seasons from defence, scoring 7 times in the club's title winning season. He is no relation to Keiran, who he has formed a solid partnership in the centre of defence over the last decade.

Ollie Saunders - Midfield

Previous Club: Norwich City Academy, Grimsby Town Academy, Braintree Town, Leiston.

Ollie signed in the summer from Leiston with plenty of experience at step 3 and step 2 at Braintree Town, with previous Academy experience at Norwich City and Grimsby Town. A very good technical midfielder that reads the game well and has a keen eye for a pass.

Luke Ingram - Attacking Midfield/Forward

Previous clubs: AFC Sudbury, Bury Town

Having made over 500 club appearances, Luke not only holds the record for the most club appearances but is the club's all time joint-record goalscorer, having notably scored the winning goals against Dartford in the FA Trophy to advance to the Quarter-Finals, and Maidstone United to book his side's spot in the FA Cup first round proper in season 2022/23. A winger by trade, Luke has scored at least 15 goals in each season of the last four seasons.

Seth Chambers - Forward

Myles Cowling - Midfield

Previous Clubs: Cambridge United, St Ives Town, AFC Sudbury

Myles also joined in the summer, having impressed at AFC Sudbury last season picking up 15 goals from attacking midfield. Another who was given a professional contract at Cambridge United with exciting potential.

Ryan Miles - Forward

Previous Clubs: Brightlingsea Regent, Maldon & Tiptree, FC Clacton

Ryan signed in the summer after scoring 15 goals at step 4 last season, following up on 31 goals at step 5 to help Wroxham to promotion. A direct, quick thinking, winger.

Olly Reynolds - Defence

Olly earned his maiden First Team call up in February after impressing as captain for the Reserves and Under-18's, skippering the latter to a Suffolk U18 Midweek Cup triumph. A solid centre-back with an eye for a pass, Ollie is certainly one for the future.

James Coton - Forward

James spent pre-season with the First Team after impressing in the club's Under-18's and Reserves last season, notably picking up a goal and an assist in the Under-18's Suffolk Midweek Cup triumph showcasing his potential.

Luca Savill - Midfield

Luca made his First Team debut in early February after impressing in his first season with the club's Reserves and Under-18s. A box to box midfielder who is another for the future.


