

From The Archives, 3 Years Ago

The Southern League Premier Division Central - Tuesday 16th August 2022, 7.45 p.m. kick-off

Bromsgrove Sporting 3 (0) Alvechurch (0) 1

Before the match, a one-minute period of silence was observed in memory of Bobby Hope who had recently passed away. Bobby guided Bromsgrove Rovers though their most successful in the 1990s with an appearance in the 3rd Round of the FA Cup and finishing second in what was then the Vauxhall Conference, now the National League.

After three points on the road, Bromsgrove Sporting returned to the Victoria Ground to face local rivals Alvechurch. Thomas Baillie's side went into this game full of optimism after a tough weekend battle against Needham Market.

One big change though to Sporting's line up was the absence of in-form Dan Sweeney who picked up an injury in the Needham game; Rouslers legend Mikey Taylor took his place.

The game started in Alvechurch's favour with Sporting keeper Ollie Taylor being called upon a few times in the opening 15 minutes. However, after a slow start to the game, Bromsgrove became more and more confident thanks to good performances from full-backs Kieron Dawes and Ammar Dyer.

Just as the second half started Sporting started on the front foot and opened the scoring through Mikey Taylor. Moments after this, Dawes scored a fabulous which is arguably already in the running for goal of the season.

Sporting though dropped off after this and Alvechurch scored through Tyrell Skeen-Hamilton on the 83rd minute and shortly after the re-start, Alvechurch could have equalised but for Ollie Taylor pulling off a candidate for save of the season for the Rouslers. With this momentum in hand, sporting took back control of the game and scored their third in added time thanks to a Ryan Edmunds goal.

The game ended 3-1 and each Sporting player could have been given the Man of the Match award an incredible performance in heavy rain.

Jack Grealish and co - the players caught in football's gilded trap Footballers stuck in a career limbo fear drop in status over wage reduction

It will, in the end, be Jack Grealish's call. A few days before Manchester City's squad flew to the United States for the Club World Cup, Grealish met with the club to work out what to do with his summer. He had been a peripheral figure for months. He had started just one Premier League game this year. With his team a goal down in the FA Cup final, Pep Guardiola had sent on a 19-year-old Argentinean debutant instead.

In that characteristically effusive manner, Guardiola said the meeting was "honest" on both sides, full of "incredible love and respect". Its final result, though, was that Grealish would not join up with his teammates in Florida. Instead, he remained behind. He would have a surfeit of time to consider his options for next season.

The general expectation — certainly outside the club and his immediate entourage — was that his absence from City's brief stay in the United States drew the curtain. It was taken as a sign he would surely leave. Offers have duly arrived. Grealish turned down the chance to move to one of Turkey's superpowers. A proposal from Napoli remains on the table.

There has, though, been no great rush of suitors to his door. That is not because of any shortage of clubs who would like to employ Grealish. It is only a couple of years, after all, since he was a central figure in Manchester City's triumphal march to the Treble; it is only four since he became the Premier League's first £100 million player. He is only 29. He is not yet in the autumn of his career. Grealish remains an elite.

There are, though, barely a handful who could conceive of paying him even half of the salary he earns at the Etihad Stadium, which is thought to stand in the region of £18 million a year, before tax. Even those that could pay tend to be well stocked in his favoured roles, and would generally reserve the sort of investment necessary to sign him for players who are younger.

Grealish finds himself, in effect, in a gilded trap: the teams that might want him cannot afford him, and the majority of the teams that can afford him do not want him.

He is not the only one caught in such a dilemma. He might find empathy for his situation among plenty of his peers. Of the England squad that reached the European Championship final in 2021 alone, for example, there are six players - including Grealish - who have spent much of this summer trying to pick their way out of it.

Some have come closer to a solution than others. Marcus Rashford has, apparently, always wanted to play for Barcelona. That deal comes with caveats, though. Barcelona cannot afford to sign him permanently, and so he is joining on an initial season-long loan. The Spanish champions are covering his salary, but he has had to forgo some bonuses. And he cannot yet be certain that he will be able to play in La Liga; Barcelona missed out on their primary target this summer, Nico Williams, because they could not guarantee that their financial situation would allow them to register him.

Juventus have been exploring the possibility of signing Jadon Sancho, his former Manchester United team-mate, on a similar basis, though quite how far that particular investigation has gone is unclear. Nottingham Forest are also thought to be willing to offer Sancho - who spent last season on loan at Chelsea - an escape route.

And then there are those whose careers seem to be in stasis. Ben Chilwell and Raheem Sterling both returned to Chelsea this summer after anticlimactic loan spells at Crystal Palace and

Arsenal respectively; neither features in Enzo Maresca's plans for this coming season, and yet neither has been inundated with offers of alternative employment. Wherever Kalvin Phillips plays this year, it will not be at Manchester City.

The phenomenon is not, of course, limited to English players: Axel Disasi and Antony all have much the same problem this summer. But it is not a coincidence that Grealish, Sterling and the rest should be among that number. It is an issue that disproportionately affects English clubs.

When Manchester United departed on their pre-season tour to the United States, they left a "bomb squad" of five players behind in Manchester. It serves both as an admittedly brutal practical measure - Ruben Amorim wanted to work with as small a group as possible so as to make his training sessions more effective - and as a powerful piece of symbolism, even if subsequently Amorim talked about the possibility of their return to the main squad if they weren't sold.

Last year, in Maresca's first summer at Stamford Bridge, Chelsea did much the same. Indeed, that case might have been even more extreme: the club had been so active in the transfer market that the changing room at their training facility in Cobham was no longer large enough to accommodate everyone. Chilwell and Sterling were among those excommunicated on that occasion. (Guardiola, for his part, has not indicated whether this is a fate that awaits either Grealish or Phillips.)

The reason that such drastic action has been deemed necessary, in both cases, is that the Premier League's gargantuan wealth is wholly anomalous to European football as a whole. English football continues to grow richer; on the continent, with three or four exceptions, margins have been winnowing. The traditional mechanics of the game's transfer market are, in effect, broken.

In previous eras, a whole class of aspirational French or middle-class Spanish clubs might have provided refuge for those deemed surplus to requirements. Now, the finances make that impossible. For a while, Serie A was the exception, thanks to a tax break offered to players from outside the European Union; its abolition, almost two years ago, dulled that fleeting edge.

Moving within the Premier League is increasingly difficult, too. Those players who have spent their careers competing for trophies find a drop in status almost more disheartening than a reduction in wages; as the league has grown smarter, more savvy, even the clubs who might once have been seen as the natural destinations for cast-offs tend to prefer players on their way up, rather than on their way down.

The result is a form of stasis: a series of loans, perhaps, loveless marriages of convenience, taken in the desperate hope that one might spark something real; or remaining stubbornly in place, hoping that a manager might change their mind.

In early July, after a month or so fielding offers, Grealish and Guardiola both attended one of Oasis's homecoming gigs at Heaton Park. They were not there together - Guardiola was with his family, Grealish had at least one well-oiled conversation with a member of the general public - but their paths did cross in a VIP area.

The two men spoke briefly, and warmly. So warmly, in fact, that Grealish came away from the conversation wondering if the best place to be might well be where he is now, contemplating whether his future might lie at Manchester City after all.



Today's Visitors - Spalding United FC - Club History

PALDING UNITED

Although long believed to have formed in 1921, research shows Spalding
United was actually founded in 1905, following the merger of Fulney Institute
and Spalding Victorias at a meeting in a local hostelry. The new club began
life at the Low Grounds, with matches also staged on Pinchbeck Road (Black
Swan Field) – the site of today's Sir Halley Stewart Playing Field, our longstanding home.

One of the most famous days in the club's history came in 1952, when a record 6,973 crowd packed into the ground for an FA Cup qualifier against Peterborough

United. Spalding led 2-0 with ten minutes to go before Posh fought back to draw and win the replay 3-0. The Tulips lifted the Lincolnshire Senior A Cup the following year and twice reached the FA Cup First Round – against Durham City in 1957/58, and in 1964/65, when they faced Football League opposition for the first time, losing 5-3.

In the league, Spalding were United Counties League runners-up three years running (1951–53) before winning the title in 1955. Spells followed in the Eastern Counties League, Central Alliance, and Midland League before returning to the UCL in 1968 and winning the championship again in 1975.

The late 1980s brought an FA Vase quarter-final in 1989/90 against Guiseley, featuring ex-England striker Frank Worthington, with 2,020 fans watching an extra-time defeat. Another Vase quarter-final came in 1998, losing 2-1 to eventual winners Tiverton Town before an even bigger crowd of 2,038. The following year saw a clean sweep – UCL champions, Lincolnshire A Cup and Hinchingbrooke Cup winners – earning a return to the Southern League in 1999/2000.

A link-up with Spalding Athletic JFC in 2011/12 brought a youth pathway, though that season ended in relegation. The Tulips bounced back with a UCL Knockout Cup win in 2012/13 and the league title in 2013/14, alongside the appointment of CEO Malcolm Gray. Back in the Evo-Stik NPL, Spalding impressed in 2014/15 (7th) and launched an under-18 team. The 2016/17 season was historic — finishing 3rd, the club's highest-ever step-four finish, and three players made the Division's Team of the Year.

After a difficult 2018/19, the club underwent a major restructure in 2019, bringing in new investors. Manager Matt Easton stepped down in December 2019, with Lewis Thorogood taking over before COVID curtailed the season. A new era began in 2020 as AK Holdings, led by Andrew Killingsworth, took ownership and appointed Leigh Porter as CEO. Porter spearheaded key initiatives, including reconnecting the club with its youth teams.

The Tulips looked to push on under Gabby Zakuani in 2021/22, before Brett Whaley steadied the ship mid-season. In 2022/23, Spalding started unbeaten until January and reached the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy Final, but fell short in the play-off final at Halesowen after an injury-time equaliser and extra-time heartbreaker. Elliot Sandy, who stepped in as interim, earned the job permanently.

The hard work paid off in April 2024, when Spalding won the Northern Premier League Midlands Division on the final day in front of 1,730 fans, sealing promotion to Step 3 with a stunning 8-0 win. Major ground upgrades followed – new dugouts, tunnel, a 100-seat stand and 40m covered terrace – to meet Step 3 standards. The club's first season at this level ended with a 7th-place finish in the Southern League Premier Central.

After a tough start to the 2024/25 season, the Tulips appointed Jimmy Dean, former Peterborough Sports promotion-winner and Scunthorpe United manager, to lead the next chapter. With a strong squad, passionate supporters, and deep community roots, Spalding United is building towards a bright future at Step 3 and beyond.

That same year, the club's off-field impact was recognised as Spalding United won both the Lincolnshire FA Club of the Year and the South Holland Community Sports Group Award for its outstanding community work. From free U16 and senior tickets to food bank collections, coffee mornings, and local outreach, the Tulips have worked hard to make football a force for good. Volunteers remain the club's heartbeat, from the organisation and running of match days, painting fences & general maintenance around the ground, to the running and coaching of the youth section, Looking ahead, further transformation is on the way in 2025/26 with the installation of a brand-new 3G pitch, generously funded by owner Andrew Killingsworth. This upgrade will provide over 20 youth teams with a winter training base in the heart of Spalding, ensuring a strong pathway for future generations.

The 2025/26 season will also see the introduction of a senior ladies team, led by Sammy Linford, marking a major step forward for the club's inclusivity and growth. In addition, a midweek Under-18 team will compete in the Thurlow Nunn Youth League – the first Spalding United youth side ever to enter the FA Youth Cup.

Spalding skipper Glenn Walker gave the home side the lead after 11 minutes but the Rouslers equalised with a minute of normal time remaining with a goal from Carter Lycett. Sporting Player of the Match was Ash Carter and the game was watched by 425 spectators.

Bromsgrove Rovers played the Tulips in a couple of Southern League Midlands Division matches in season 2006/7. The first game on 29th September 2006 saw Rovers win 2 -0 in front of a crowd of 346; Kevin Banner (80 mins) and Nathan Lamey (90 mins) scoring for the home side.

At the reverse fixture played on 27th January 2007, Spalding gained revenge with a 1 - 0 victory. 140 spectators saw Danny Hargreaves get the only goal of the game on the 76th minute.



Bromsgrove Sporting Under 21s

Matt Tennant, reflects on the Under 21s first season as a team, as pre-season friendlies are underway ahead of their upcoming season...

Bromsgrove Sporting's U21's debut season has come to an end and, as preparations for the 25/26



season get underway, we are taking time to reflect on the many successes of the club's development side in their first season.

The team finished third in the Midland Football League's U21 South Division, after an impressive campaign that included long winning streaks and strong away form

"As preparations for the new season begin, I wanted to take a moment to look back and reflect on a fantastic first season for our U21 team," said the Director of Football at Sporting, Iain Queen.

"We have been delighted with the progress that the team have made, and a massive part of that is down the management team. Mark (Reeve), Stuart (Carson) and Pete (Rose) have worked tirelessly to put together a competitive group of lads, who week after week having given everything for the club. They are a fantastic group of lads and I know from speaking to the management team that they have been a pleasure to coach week in week out.

"Our journey started with over 180 applicants, so there was a real interest from local players to come and represent Bromsgrove Sporting FC. Over the course of the season, players have come and gone and I would like to personally thank them all for their efforts when putting on a Bromsgrove

Sporting shirt," said Queen.

Last season, the team fought hard throughout their fixtures in the South Division, which ignited a thrilling battle with Bedworth United U21s.

The two sides frequently traded positions throughout the season until Bromsgrove narrowly stepped ahead of the Greenbacks to claim a hard-fought podium finish.

Under-21s coach, Pete Rose, said: "I think the team gelled from day one, in no part because of their character.

"There's no egos or bad eggs and when we ask them to put a shift in at training or during a game they all do so with no questions or fuss.

"As a coach, the most pleasing thing for me is that I can see that the players have developed and improved as the season progressed. As we played games, you could see momentum building and each week we looked stronger as a unit."

The U21s also enjoyed spirited matchups in the Worcestershire Cup, which saw electrifying local action that included goalscoring frenzies and last minute penalty shootout glory.

The team progressed to the semi-finals, where they faced Meadow Park FC away, but despite their best efforts, the home side took the win to end a thrilling competition for Bromsgrove.

Although the team has achieved a series of impressive results in their debut season, arguably the most astounding was their performance in the MFL Challenge Bowl, in which they won five out of five group stage fixtures, with perfect away form helping them finish joint top out of 19 teams.

After stunning in the group stage, the U21s progressed to the quarter finals and semi finals, where they were beaten by Stourbridge U21s after an intense second half. This match brought the Rouslers' first season to a close.

Bromsgrove Sporting's U21s joint-manager, Mark Reeve, said: "From the 2024 trials, to the backing of Bromsgrove Sporting and our sponsors to end of season, we couldn't have asked for much more last season.

"Finishing third in the League and joint top in the Challenge bowl, with a semi final placement, capped off a fine first year for the team."

It's no secret that the intention of a development team is to nurture young talent and create bona fide pathways to play at a higher level within the club.

Over the last year, many Bromsgrove U21s players signed forms for the first team, with three of those players joining the men's team for the 25/26 season.

Zac Powell was the first to be recruited by the first team after attracting attention in the early days of the U21s group. He was followed by Archie Thurston and Bo Morris, who signed up for first team duties in October 2024 after impressing in their early appearances for the U21s, with goalkeeper Charlie McNamara also receiving the call up and stunning spectators on a number of occasions.

"What was also pleasing was to see numerous players go on and play for the first team," continued lain Queen.

"Zac Powell was picked up by the first team after impressing in the initial trials, then other players such as Charlie McNamara, Bo Morris, and Archie Thurston have all gone on to represent the first team."

Powell, Thurston, Morris and McNamara making their debuts has shown the significant success of Bromsgrove's new development side and has developed a relationship between both the U21s and first team management with a common interest in creating opportunities for young talent.

Since then, a number of U21s players have also been given opportunities to train with the first team and gain additional experience, with George Gillon, Josh Burgess and Fin Carson being the latest names to put pen to paper and make the step up to the Men's team.

"So far this pre season we have had Fin Carson, George Gillon and Josh Burgess all play a part in pre season. These are all signs that the pathway is working."

The three U21s alumni have continued training with the first team and will be available for selection in the upcoming season.

Queen added: "Like any non league club, it is difficult to keep hold of players who are performing well, and I encourage any young player to remain patient, stick with your coaches and, if you are good enough, the opportunities will come.

"It is a big jump from the development league up to Step Three, but the club have contacts with many local clubs who we can send our youngsters out with to experience a different environment. If they are developing under our Bromsgrove Sporting banner, then it is much easier for us to track and monitor their progress."

Pete Rose added: "This season will bring its own challenges and, as a team, we need to set ourselves some targets to ensure we push each other to maximise the undoubted ability all the boys have."

The U21s continue preparations for their second season with pre-season action well underway. You can catch the team back on the field for the start of their 25/26 season very soon!
