From The Archives, 14 Years Ago

The Athium Midland Football Combination Division 1 10th September 2011 3:00 pm kick-off

Bromsgrove Sporting 4 (1) v (0) 1 Stretton Eagles

Bromsgrove Sporting bounced back from their midweek defeat with a win by a convincing scoreline against high-flying Stretton Eagles. After their midweek defeat coach Stewart Brighton shuffled his resources and brought in Neil Cooksey and Richard Griffiths as his centre back partnership, moving Martin Keight to a holding midfield role. Also missing after Tuesday were Kevin Banner, Danny Lismore and the unlucky Adam Humphries with skipper Jamie Rogers also dropped to the bench with Lismore.

Sporting set about their task well and looked solid against a quite physical Stretton outfit. Sporting had a golden opportunity to open the scoring on 18 minutes as Zac Blood centred from the left but the unmarked Odane Barnes contrived to head over an open goal. Shortly after, Chris Bright fired just over the angle as he found half a yard of space inside the area.

On 38 minutes Sporting went ahead after some quick thinking as Jon Rogers was fouled on half way and Joe Brookes swept a great ball across the field for Chris Bright who knocked a cross to the far post for Jon Rogers to pick his spot with a header past the despairing keeper Beeston.

Sporting's defence remained solid for the rest of the half except for a moment on 44 minutes when Griffiths was caught on the ball and earned himself a booking trying to retrieve possession as he pulled back the Stretton forward who had just robbed him.

Half-time Bromsgrove Sporting 1 v 0 Stretton Eagles.

Stretton came out for the second half determined to get back on terms and with two substitutions at the interval, started to dominate possession although a tame Zac Blood shot was cleared off the Stretton goal-line. Stretton then came close as Sporting keeper Biddle blundered in his area and was dispossessed but fortunately the ball ran out of play before Stretton could take advantage. The equaliser came on 72 minutes as Sporting's backline were manoeuvred out of position and Phil Weldon ran through to side foot past Biddle.

Stretton looked the more likely to go on and win but Sporting rang the changes as Siviter came on for Jon Rogers who had taken a knock and Danny Lismore replaced Chris Bright. In the end it was Sporting who went on to win as Stretton hadn't reckoned on the pace of Barnes as he first of all nipped in to take a Joe Brookes through ball round the hesitant Beeston to put Sporting 2-1 up on 83 minutes. Then he took another through ball into the channel from Brookes to the goal line before looking up and playing a perfectly weighted pass for Nick Harris to tap home.

Finally, on 90 minutes he dispossessed a Stretton defender on the edge of the box and hit a rasping shot which came back to him off the cross bar and he volleyed his second and Sporting's fourth. After a couple of minutes injury time the referee blew for time and saved the now dispirited Eagles any further punishment.

The Non-League Paper provides a column for club programmes each week. This week's contribution is from Jon Couch.

LAST year's FA Cup concluded with one of the biggest final shocks in modern history after Crystal Palace stunned Manchester City at Wembley, and this year's episode has started in much the same vein with cup shocks aplenty already whetting the appetite for the campaign ahead.

Take last Saturday's preliminary round. Atherton Laburnum Rovers were handed the dream tie against higher-ranked town rivals Atherton Collieries in what was the first-ever competitive Flat Cap derby.

Michael Clegg's Collieries, from Northern Premier League Division One West were strong favourites to show their superiority but it was Step 5 LR who turned on the style in front of a near 1,000 crowd to come through 5-1 to complete one of the most famous days in the club's history.

Victory earned Dave Jones' North West Counties League side a potentially lucrative second qualifying round trip to Clegg's former club, Macclesfield, where an estimated 3,000 crowd will welcome them in to Moss Rose.

"Winning the league [last season] will take some topping, but this is a close second," Jones told our reporters afterwards. "These lads have played in so many big games now, and they just weren't fazed."

But you can't talk cup upsets without mentioning Tadley Calleva. The Combined Counties League side hosted a Weymouth team who were playing National League South football last season and welcoming popular boss Steve Claridge back in their dugout for the first time in 21 years.

But, in a lunchtime kick-off in front of the BBC cameras, Joe Lawlor's Calleva rallied to a 4-2 victory to reach the second qualifying round for the first time in their history.

Whitstable Town know all about performing on the big occasion – they lifted the FA Vase at Wembley last season with an extra-time success over AFC Whyteleafe. And the Oystermen were at it again last weekend when travelling a Dulwich Hamlet side who have started their Isthmian Premier season strongly under boss Mark Dacey and came away with an impressive 3-2 victory at Champion Hill.

Next up for them is a home tie against another club from the same Step 3 division, Chichester City, conquerors of Havant & Waterlooville. While Whitstable will fancy their chances of pulling off another upset next weekend, there are a number of other clubs with one eye on a third qualifying round berth.

Stalybridge Celtic, already conquerors of former Football League clubs Bury and Workington, will be looking to add a third when they host Chester, while Step 5 Chadderton, have been rewarded for seeing off Bishop Auckland in the last round with a glamour trip to NPL Premier leaders FC United of Manchester.

Ben Herd's Hertford Town will relish a trip to full-timers Chelmsford City, while Jersey Bulls manager Elliott Powell describes his side's visit of Worthing as "absolutely massive" and "the biggest fixture we have ever had".

Two Step 5 sides are gearing towards huge ties against Step 2 opponents.

In the south-west, Torpoint Athletic have reached this stage for the first time in their history and make the trip to Penydarren Park to face Southern Premier Central champions Merthyr Town, while Wessex League Laverstock & Ford head to the Ray Mac Stadium to take on Salisbury.

But, arguably, the standout tie of the round sees Step 2 Enfield FC host their rivals from Step 2, Enfield Town in an intriguing match-up. This will be the first competitive match between the two sides for over 14 years, although the pair were drawn to each other in 2021 before Enfield Town lost their replay to Hadley.

Alex Salmon's FC underdogs need only look to Atherton LR for inspiration in a competition which just keeps producing the unexpected. Who will be next to step up to the plate?

Premier League Clubs Strike New Shirt Sponsor Deals with Gambling Firms Despite Looming Ban

With the season now well underway, the link between gambling and football is again under scrutiny. The *Big Issue* magazine recently carried the following article.

11 of the Premier League's 20 clubs will start the new season with a gambling sponsor on the front of their shirts, and no club has abandoned betting firms.

Premier League football clubs have struck fresh deals with gambling firms to sponsor the front of their shirts, as the number of teams with gambling sponsors remains at more than half despite clubs agreeing to a voluntary ban from next season.

It has led to the upcoming ban, which takes place at the end of the upcoming 25/26 season, being branded a "cynical ploy".

A total of 11 clubs will go into the start of the season with gambling sponsors on the front for the 25/26 season, the same number as the previous season.

Nearly every club has kept the same sponsor as the year before, with the exception of West Ham, who replaced previous betting sponsor Betway with Irish gambling firm Boyle Sports, and Nottingham Forest, who have replaced Kaiyun with UK-licensed betting firm Bally's.

No club previously adorned with a gambling company on the front of their shirt has moved to a non-gambling sponsor for this season.

"The voluntary ban on front-of-shirt gambling sponsors is a cynical ploy to resist tighter regulation of gambling advertising," Will Prochaska, director of the Coalition to End Gambling Ads, told Big Issue.

"Following the ban, gambling logos will still be visible elsewhere on shirts and all around the stadiums, so the effect will be minimal, but it was used by government as evidence of action being taken when in fact the status quo has been maintained."

The upcoming season, which began on 15 August, marks the last year clubs can have gambling sponsors on the front of their shirts, having agreed a voluntary ban for the start of the 26/27 season. While it covers front of shirt sponsors, clubs will still be allowed to strike deals for shirt sleeves, pitch-side hoardings and more.

Gambling is linked to anywhere between 117 and 496 suicides in the UK each year, research from the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities estimated in 2023.

Clubs are believed to have made £101 million from their deals with gambling shirt sponsors in the 24/25 season, according to GlobalData. The ban could cut the value of shirt sponsorships by 38%, The Sponsor found.

No club in the so-called "Big Six" - Arsenal, Chelsea, Liverpool, Manchester City, Manchester United and Tottenham - has a front-of-shirt gambling sponsor. Outside the "Big Six", just Brighton, Leeds and Newcastle have shirt sponsors not linked to betting - and those deals are linked to the clubs' ownerships or long-standing stadium sponsors.

Several clubs were warned in May that they face potential prosecution over partnerships with unlicensed brands. Yet their new shirts still feature those brands, though the Gambling Commission tells Big Issue it is down to the clubs to make sure the firms have a license to operate in the UK.

Forest owner Evangelos Marinakis said the club was working with Bally's, the company behind Virgin Games, Jackpotjoy and Double Bubble Bingo, "on a number of exciting initiatives".

The result is shirts not all players can wear. When 15-year-old Jeremy Monga made his debut for Leicester in April 2025, he came onto the pitch wearing a shirt with no sponsor, instead of the team's BC Game-branded kit.

Annie Ashton, whose husband Luke took his own life in 2021, an incident in which a coroner said Betfair missed opportunities to intervene, said she was saddened that clubs had kept taking money from gambling firms.

"It saddens me that some football clubs have once again decided to both normalise gambling and ignore the devastating damage it causes to many," she told Big Issue.

"It's so disappointing that they've chosen to line their pockets by partnering with gambling operators and advertising it on their shirt-fronts to millions of their fans including children. It must stop."



Today's Visitors - Banbury United FC - Club History

Banbury United's genesis is to be found in a works club formed by the Spencer Corsets Factory of Banbury in 1931. Friendly matches were played on a ground on the town's Middleton Road in their first two seasons. The club joined the Banbury & District Junior League for the 1933-34 season, initially competing as Spencer Villa before changing their name to Banbury Spencer mid-season, winning the championship of Section C at their first attempt. The club moved to their current ground for the start of the 1934-35 season in which they competed in the Oxfordshire Senior League. This too they won at their first attempt. During the season they were elected to the Birmingham Combination for the start of the 1935-36 season.

After the war, Banbury resumed in the Birmingham Combination and turned professional for the 1946-47 season. In 1947-48, with attendances averaging 3,500, they finished runners-up in the league and reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time, losing 2-1 at Colchester United, at that time a Southern League club. The next season the ground attendance record was broken when 7,160 turned up to see Banbury lose to Oxford City in the third qualifying round of the FA Cup. Banbury's manager at this time was Jimmy Cringan, who had joined them in 1936 and was to remain 'The Boss' for no less than 25 years until his retirement in 1961.

The status of the Birmingham Combination began to decline in the early 1950s. At the end of the 1953-54 season the league disbanded and, along with most of its remaining clubs, Banbury joined the Birmingham League. In 1961-62, Banbury reached the first round of the FA Cup for the second time, travelling to Third Division Shrewsbury Town, losing 7-1.

The Birmingham League continued to expand and became the West Midlands League in 1962. This coincided with the effective independence of the football club, the Spencer company having all but ended its association. The club name remained unchanged, however, until April 1965 when, with the club's finances suffering – attendances had fallen to a historical low – a group of local businessmen acquired the club. Banbury Spencer became Banbury United.

The new owners were ambitious and were looking to a higher grade of football. Former Chelsea, West Ham, Arsenal and England player Len Goulden was installed as manager. During the summer of 1966 Banbury were elected to the Southern League. Significant improvements were made to the ground. Floodlights were installed and the famous old railway coaches that had been used as changing rooms were removed and replaced by a new clubhouse.

United then embarked on an unbroken 24-season run as members of the Southern League. They came close to league honours in 1967-68 when they finished in seventh place in the First Division, just two points and three places behind Rugby Town who were promoted to the Premier Division. The First Round Proper of the FA Cup was reached twice more; in 1972-73, United lost 2-0 at home to Barnet, then a Southern League club, and the following season, after a 0-0 draw at home, they lost 3-2 away to Fourth Division Northampton Town in a replay. United twice reached the last sixteen of the FA Trophy, losing 1-0 in a replay to Hereford United in 1970-71 and, in 1973-4, by the same score in a second replay to eventual Southern League champions Dartford.

From the late 1970s, United's fortunes declined sharply as debts mounted. The ownership of the ground was given up in the 1980s as security against the club's debts. On the field the team was also struggling, finishing in the top half of the table just twice in twelve seasons after 1978. In 1990, United finished 21st of 22 and were relegated for the first time in their history, starting season 1990-91 in the Hellenic League. Those fans who expected a quick return to the Southern League were to be disappointed. However, from 1997 onwards a revived and expanded committee brought about such an improvement in financial circumstances that the club was ready to aim for promotion. Former Oxford, Newcastle and QPR player Kevin Brock was appointed first team manager for the 1999-2000 campaign.

United's form up to Christmas of 1999 was good but they entered the New Year no fewer than nineteen points behind leaders Highworth Town. In only eight weeks they overhauled their rivals with a run of 13 consecutive victories and remained unbeaten for the rest of the season. A 3-1 victory at Wantage Town clinched the Hellenic League championship with two games remaining and Banbury United were back in the Southern League.

United took a couple of seasons to find their feet in the Eastern division, finishing 13th and 15th. Eighth place in 2003 was their best in the Southern League in 25 years. That was equalled the following season, enough to qualify for a play-off for a place in a reformed Premier Division in the restructured non-League pyramid. Banbury beat Sutton Coldfield Town of the Western division, coming from behind to win in stoppage time in extra-time.

A difficult first season in the Premier division (2004-05) was followed by a much better second. Seventh place in season 2005-06 was an improvement of ten places but thirteenth in 2006-07 was a big disappointment. However, it was troubles off the field that made the headlines. Shortly after the season ended, manager Kevin Brock resigned.

Relegation was avoided in 2009 as the annual bout of resignations and demotions elsewhere in the Pyramid resulted in a reprieve. In 2012 a last-day victory ensured safety. Season 2013-14 began well enough – United were eighth in the table in early February – but more drastic budget cuts were applied. Another player exodus resulted; there followed a most embarrassing run of defeats as the team plummeted to 19th, conceding 43 goals in nine games. The dismal form continued into the 2014-15 season and the inevitable occurred. After 11 years in the Premier division level the club was relegated and was placed in the South & West division for the 2015-16 season.

Change, however, was on its way. For a year, fans had been discreetly working on a takeover. Advised by Supporters Direct, the supporters club launched its bid towards the end of the season. Agreement was reached with the existing board and in May 2015 the club appointed a new manager, ex-Oxford United player and Brackley Town and Oxford City manager Mike Ford. He had to assemble a new squad from scratch. Early form was moderate with only four wins from the first 12 games but the team hit form to win 24 of the next 30 and finish runners-up to Cinderford. A nervy victory in the play-off semi-final against Winchester set up a final showdown with third-placed Taunton Town. In front of more than 1,200 spectators, the club's biggest attendance for more than 21 years, United won 2-0 to regain their place in the Premier Division at the first attempt.

Season 2016/17 saw United finish in sixth place, the club's best in the post-2004 Pyramid. Though this was followed by a creditable ninth place finish in season 2017/18, season 2018/19 was rather a disappointment, albeit never in serious danger of relegation, with the club finishing down in 17th place. In season 2019/20 the club were just outside the play-offs when the season was abandoned.

May 2020 would see Mike Ford leave the manager's post, to be replaced by former Andy Whing. Though season 2020/21 was seriously curtailed due to Covid, the club reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time since 1973, United losing 2-1 at home to Canvey Island.

Few would argue that season 2021/22 was the best in the club's over 90 years history. The FA Cup First Round Proper was reached for the second consecutive season, the club hosting League 2 side Barrow. Though losing 3-0, it was great to see supporters, unlike the previous year, able to enjoy the occasion with a sell-out crowd of 2,400 in attendance. But it was United's league form for which the season will most be remembered, just two defeats all season with the club hitting the top of the table in mid-December and pulling away to win the Southern League Central Division Championship by an incredible 23 points to earn for the first time in the club's history a place in the National League Regional Divisions.

Season 2022/23 began well for the Puritans, challenging for a play-off place until a poor run of form from March onwards saw the club sliding down the table. Despite just one win in their last 18 league games, the good start to the season meant United managed to finish just above the relegation zone. The end of the season saw Andy Whing resign from the manager's position with the club appointing former Oxford City and Hemel Hempstead Town boss Mark Jones to the post. However, after a poor run of form, the end of January saw Jones relieved of his duties and the club appointed former Banbury United player Kevin Wilson to the manager's post but he was unable to turn United's form around and the club finished third from bottom of the table, meaning relegation back to the Southern League for last season. The summer of 2024 saw Simon Hollyhead, a former Assistant Manager at Malmo, SK Brann, Odense and Stevenage, appointed as the club's manager. The club finished in mid-table last season but Hollyhead was subsequently dismissed Former United player Kelvin Langmead who made 375 Football League appearances in his playing career was appointed manager ahead of the current season.

30-year-old left-sided striker whose career started as a Youth player at Tottenham Hotspur, Celtic and Stoke City before making his professional debut with Stoke City.

Joel Anker

20-year-old attacking midfielder who came through the MK Dons Academy, progressing to earn a professional contract in June 2023.

George Ball

26-year-old forward who joined Banbury United in July 2024. Previously with Daventry Town and Loughborough Dynamo. Quick and direct and can play through the middle or out wide.

Keegan Bloom

22-year-old full back who is happy on both flanks but normally plays as a right-back. First played for Harrow Borough in their under U23's before spells with North Greenwood United and Aylesbury United.

Connor Ferguson

22-year-old striker who was with Oxford United as a youngster and then after being released in the summer of 2020, he has played for Didcot Town, Thame United and Kidlington..

Josh Flanagan

21-year-old right back who came through the Northampton Town Academy, progressing to earn a professional contract in May 2021. After his release Josh joined Brackley Town in July 2022. Joined Banbury United in June 2025.

Max Fuller

16-year-old full back who has come through the Banbury United youth set-up, playing for the Club's U18 Development side last season.

Harley Giles

24-year-old midfielder who was with the Oxford United Academy and then after a spell with Ardley United Joined Southern League Didcot Town in February 2020. Returned to Banbury for a second spell at the start of this season.

Marcel Guzynski

18-year-old left sided player who is currently on loan from MK Dons. Signed a professional contract with Dons this past summer.

Jack Harding

33-year-old goalkeeper who came through the Banbury United youth side and would progress to be a regular in the reserve side, also making five first team appearances before having spells with Hellenic League sides Hook Norton and Ardley United. Returned to Banbury United in the summer of 2015.

Nico Jones

23-year-old central defender who came through the Fulham Academy before joining Oxford United on a scholarship, progressing to earn a two-year professional contract. Made three League One appearances whilst at Oxford and also had loan spells at Oxford City and Havant & Waterlooville. Joined Banbury in June 2024.

18-year-old midfielder who has progressed to the first team squad from United's Development team. Signed for Banbury in August 2024, and looks very promising.

19-year-old striker who is currently on loan from Watford. Joined Watford Academy from Cray Valley Paper Mills in 2023, before being awarded a professional contract with Watford in May 2024.

Aaron McCreadie

24-year-old central midfielder who came through the Oxford United Academy, progressing to earn a professional contract in 2019. Joined Banbury in July 2025.

Yaw Ofosu

28-year-old central defender who joined Banbury in June 20124, having played for Alvechurch in season 2023/24 whom he joined the previous season from Cambridge City. Prior to his four seasons at Cambridge, Yaw has been with Newport Pagnell Town. Club Captain.

28-year-old left back who is a product of the MK Dons Academy. Spent four seasons with Dunstable Town prior to joining Banbury United or the first time in the summer of 2019. Joined Banbury for a second spell in August 2024.


