## From The Archives, 10 Years Ago The Midland Football League Division One

#### Saturday 10th October 2015, 3:00 p.m. kick-off at the Victoria Ground

#### **Bromsgrove Sporting 3 (2) Pershore Town 0 (0)**

A record crowd saw Bromsgrove Sporting breeze to a 3-0 victory over Pershore Town in the Midland Football League Division One on Saturday afternoon.

A delicately placed Simon Fitter free kick from just outside the area got the home side's afternoon off to the best possible start after a quarter of an hour. Further goals from Liam Spink and Sean Brain helped Sporting to record another league win, with 553 people in attendance on what was "Non-League Day".

Spink almost opened the scoring on twelve minutes but his shot was wide of the post. However, Fitter was more accurate with his free kick, which followed a foul on the lively Connor Collins. Keeping the ball low, it sailed past the wall and into the bottom corner.

Sporting almost doubled their lead after half an hour when a Luke Dugmore corner came to Ricardo Richards, who hoisted his volley over the bar as he seeks his first goal on his return to the club.

Richards was to be involved in the second goal though, his blocked effort inside the box fell to Spink, whose effort collided off the underside of the bar and into the net, giving Sporting breathing space as they headed into the break.

The Rouslers almost added to their tally after the interval but squandered numerous chances. Pershore keeper Andrew Yarnold saved shots from Collins and Spink plus another free kick from Fitter that was destined for the top corner.

Substitute Brain had three chances of putting the game to bed inside the final ten minutes. The first a shot struck wide after some neat interplay with Reece Hewitt, the second well saved by Yarnold but the third was coolly placed into the corner after benefiting from a pinpoint Spink pass.

For the second Saturday in a row, the talismanic Brain scored with virtually the last kick of the game and it sealed what was a routine victory for Sporting, with goalkeeper Josh Moreton having a fairly quiet afternoon.

## Bury Town recently found themselves in the national press after one of their opponents travelled via Bury FC

The wrong Bury: footballer takes 200-mile diversion after mixing up towns.



A non-league defender played a vital cameo in securing three away points for his team on Tuesday night. But in playing the last two minutes of Spalding's backs-to-the-wall away win at Bury St Edmunds, Lewis White was carrying a guilty secret: he had gone to the wrong Bury first.

The 24-year-old had travelled for the Southern Football League Premier central fixture against Bury Town under his own steam and

driven from his home in Leicestershire. Instead of heading east to Bury St Edmunds in Suffolk, however, he drove north to Bury in Greater Manchester and added 200 miles to his journey in the process.

First reported by LincsOnline, White appears to have driven all the way to Bury FC's Gigg Lane before realising his error. After schlepping back down the A14, he arrived at Getaway Cars Stadium, home of Bury Town, in time to help close out victory for the Tulips, with Spalding winning 2-1 despite playing with 10 men.

Their manager, Jimmy Dean, said: "I asked the people at Bury if it had ever happened before and they said it hadn't. He must have been in a world of his own, but he's come and helped see the game out for us and it's always a fantastic feeling to win a midweek match."

Spalding moved up to fourth on the back of the result, ahead of Quorn on goal difference but four points off the leaders, Harborough. Their next fixture is an FA Cup qualifying round fixture against Dagenham & Redbridge on Saturday.







The Non-League Paper provides a column for club programmes each week. This week's contribution is from the Editor-at-Large, Matt Badcock.

IS there any better weekend in the English football calendar than the FA Cup first round proper? We've long felt this is where we see the true heartbeat of English football - even through the qualifying rounds there are clubs living out their FA Cup dreams.

But the anticipation certainly builds as the proper stage of the competition approaches.

This weekend, 64 clubs take to the pitch hoping they can be one of the 32 Non-League names in the big draw televised on Monday night. Dreaming they can get the plum tie that catapults them into the spotlight and, potentially, changes the course of their future.

We know there will be at least one Step 4 side in the famous velvet bag with Isthmian North title hopefuls Maldon & Tiptree welcoming Flackwell Heath, of Southern League Division One Central.

The hosts have a manager in Kevin Horlock who knows all about the big moments in football. He, of course, scored for Manchester City in that famous comeback play-off final win over Gillingham at Wembley in 1999.

And in their squad they boast former Premier League players like Freddie Sears and Gary Hooper, who even scored for Celtic against Barcelona.

Horlock freely admits the pressure is on when it comes to delivering promotion this season for their ambitious owners, but a big FA Cup run would be an added bonus.

Not that he's getting carried away with Flackwell Heath showing what they're all about in their 3-0 win at Step 3 Bracknell Town to get to this stage.

Two of their goalscorers that night – Jamie and Matthew Ayres – are the sons of manager Chris! How's that for an FA Cup fairytale if they could make it through to the first round proper?

Chris will be tuning in from holiday this week, however, with a long-booked trip of a lifetime to South Africa!

Runcorn Linnets are the other Step 4 side dreaming of glory. They upset Ashton United in the FA Cup third round qualifying and will need to overturn the odds again when they host National League North Buxton. But the lowest-ranked side left in the competition are from Step 5 – and a team already familiar with the

Whitstable Town have knocked out three Step 3 sides – Dulwich Hamlet, Chichester City and Hungerford Town – to set up their away trip to Wealdstone.

national stage following last season's FA Vase triumph.

It's already the club's best FA Cup run, and manager Jamie Coyle has been putting in the hours with his management staff to do their homework on the National League Stones.

A quirk of how the fourth round qualifying regions had to be split ahead of the third round qualifying replays means Billericay Town are making the long trip to Spennymoor Town on Saturday, while Gateshead are heading in the other direction to Aveley!

And how about up-and-coming Farnham Town hosting one of the biggest games in their club's history when Sutton United are in town.

Sutton know all about causing an upset to create FA Cup history. Their motivation, as for many of the National League clubs this time out, is not to be on the other end this year!

## Rovers historians Michael Tovey and Graham Reynolds continue their journey though 140 years of Bromsgrove football, choosing their player of the decade for the 1900s

The start of the 20<sup>th</sup> century saw Bromsgrove Rovers playing at the Well Lane ground and competing in the Birmingham & District League. It's fair to say they were finding life a bit tough, a couple of seasons in the early part of the decade they were required to go cap in hand to their peers and apply for re-election. The 1904/05 season provided a rare chink of light when they finished runners-up, although they spent most of the rest of the decade in the bottom half of the league. The 1908/09 season saw Rovers playing in the Birmingham Combination, although in truth this was purely a rebranding exercise, the same teams were in the League, just under a new name. A much bigger change came in 1909/10 when the Rovers moved from Well Lane to the Victoria Ground, their home for the next hundred years. Whilst they struggled in the League, the decade did end on a high with Rovers capturing the Birmingham Junior Charity Shield.

Although not one of the Rovers better decades, they were still blessed with some fine players. William "Gasser" Mason took over from George Stiles in goal for the second half of the decade and notched up over a hundred appearances himself. Roger Webley, another member of the '100 club', could always be relied upon to do whatever job was asked of him. While up front, goals were plentiful, courtesy of Tommy Atkins, Frank Stiles - the younger brother of George, and who for a period was the club's record goal scorer - and Leonard Stallard. Stallard tragically lost his life after playing for the Rovers and sustaining a knee injury, which turned into Lockjaw (tetanus), and he passed away in 1907 at the age of just 23. Who knows how great a player he could have gone on to be, but 46 goals in 56 games suggests he was on the right path.

There were however two particular stalwarts for the Rovers in this decade. Henry "Laddie" Harris, of Catshill, who made over 170 appearances, predominately in the half-back line, between 1899 and 1911, and Horatio Skinner, the first choice left back from 1903 to 1911. It is Skinner who we have chosen as our 'Player of the Decade' for the 1900s.

The wonderfully named Horatio Nelson Skinner was born on 24 August 1882, in Birmingham. He was given a trial by the Rovers in a Birmingham & District League match against Brades Park, a side from Oldbury, on 12 December 1903. Rovers got a 6-1 thumping, but he must have done something right as he was picked at left-back for the rest of the season. Although this was not a successful campaign for the Rovers as they faced the ignominy of having to apply for re-election.

He was briefly captain at the start of the 1904/05 campaign until a committee meeting at the end of September decided to give that role to his partner in the back line, J. Caldicutt. The Rovers really turned things around that season and they reaped the rewards of having a settled team, with Horatio certainly one of the first names of the team sheet. They finished runners-up in the league, although, in reality, they were never quite in contention for the title with Coombs Wood, a Halesowen based works side, ending up six points clear. And remember, it was two points for a win back in those days.

In the next three campaigns he missed just the one game and the *Messenger* often praised him in their match reports. He got one of his rare as hen's teeth goals in the game against Bournville Athletic in September, 1905, scoring directly from a free kick. But the Rovers as a team found the going tough finishing 10<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> in the League over that period.

1908/09 saw the Rovers playing in the re-branded Birmingham Combination and Horatio was once more made captain. He obviously liked playing against Bournville Athletic, as he again found the net against them, this time in the Birmingham Charity Shield, scoring from the spot. He was ever present in the side until he twisted his knee in a match against Bournbrook in March, which put him out of action for the rest of the season.

1909/10 was an important season in the club's history as it saw the Rovers moving to the Victoria Ground. Horatio had obviously suffered a very nasty injury as he was still out of action at the start of the season, missing the first ever game at the Vic, a 3-3 draw against Willenhall Swifts. He returned for the next game and once again made the left-back position his own. Although Rovers finished 12<sup>th</sup> in the League, they did triumph in the Birmingham Junior Charity Shield, with Horatio playing a solid game in a 2-0 victory over Bournbrook at the Austin Motors Ground in Northfield.

He had one more season as first choice left-back before he was ousted in 1911/12 by Billy Barrett, who, after the War, went on to play in the Football League with Leicester City and Derby County. Barrett moved on to Nuneaton Town in the 1912/13 campaign and Horatio was back at left-back. In December, he even played in goal in a match when Wilmore, the regular keeper, failed to turn up. He played the first half between the sticks before swapping with fellow back Jerry Bridgwater at half-time. Apparently he made a couple of good saves, but couldn't stop Nuneaton netting four goals before the break.

Ahead of season 1912/13, his brother, Alfred, took part in one of the regular practice/trial matches the club would hold for prospective new players. Although Alfred signed with the Rovers, he only made the one appearance, as a half-back, against Dudley Phoenix in November. Horatio played in his customary left-back position in the same game, and while it was only one appearance, you can add the Skinners to the list of brothers that have played for the Rovers.

Father time was by now catching up with Horatio, and injury put him out of action, with the game against Birmingham Trams on 4 January, 1913, being his last in a Rovers shirt, bringing an end to a fine career. The esteem he was held in by his peers was made clear when he was presented with a pair of bronzes by Elizabeth Stiles, Landlady of the Rovers Headquarters, the Roebuck Inn, on the occasion of his marriage to May Noon, in April 1912, and as a mark of recognition of the good service he had rendered to the Rovers Club.

It is from this marriage that we were able, by checking marriage records, to work out his full name, as oddly, even though he played for the Rovers for over ten years, the *Bromsgrove Messenger* only ever referred to him as H. Skinner. Sadly, to date we have been unable to find any picture of Horatio.

After leaving the Rovers, he served as a Private in the First World War in both the Worcestershire and Royal Warwickshire Regiments. Away from football, he worked as a metal spinner for Randle & Smith in Birmingham. He passed away in October, 1960, aged 78. Horatio Skinner, a true Rovers great, 1903-1913. 238 appearances, 2 goals.



### Today's Visitors - Bury Town FC - Club History

Bury Town FC was founded by Mr William Lake at a meeting at the Suffolk Hotel in 1872, making the club one of the oldest non-league clubs currently still in existence in England.

The first official name of the club was Bury St Edmunds FC and royal blue and white were chosen as the club's official colours.

The clubs first home ground was located on Kings Road and was also known as the Cemetery Road ground. The Club was a founder member of the Suffolk County Football Association in 1885.

A notable player for the club in the early days was Reginald De Courtney Welch who appeared as a defender for Bury St Edmunds in 1877. De Courtney Welch was a member of The Wanderers side that won the first ever FA Cup in 1872 and he also played in the first ever official international match for England, against Scotland in November 1872.

The club played in various local leagues until it became a founder member of the Eastern Counties Football League in 1935. The Club spent 22 consecutive seasons in the League, winning the League Challenge Cup in two occasions in 1961-62 and 1963-64.

Kings Road was the first football ground in East Anglia to operate floodlights when on Monday 12th January 1953, the Blues played their first ever floodlit game against Cambridge City in front of 2,105 spectators. A total of 14 bulbs of 1500 watts illuminated the Suffolk skyline for the first time and history was created. The lights were financed by the Bury Town Supporters Club.

The 1963-64 season was a memorable one for the club as it lifted the ECL league championship, the League Cup and the Suffolk County FA Premier Cup to record an historic treble.

This success saw the club elect to move to the Metropolitan & District Football League for the 1964-65 season and it was another period of success as the Club won the Metropolitan League championship in 1965-66 and 1968-69. There was another treble in 1965-66 as along with the championship, the Club won the Metropolitan League Cup and the Suffolk Premier Cup again.

In 1968, the Blues reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup and drew Third Division side Bournemouth & Boscombe at Kings Road. 3,000 spectators assembled and witnessed Bury hold the Football League side to a goalless draw. The replay saw Bournemouth win through by 3 goals to 0 at Dean Court.

After the Metropolitan League folded at the end of the 1970-71 season, the Club joined the Southern Football League for the first time in their history. Success at the higher level was harder to come by and after 5 seasons, the Club elected to drop back down to the Eastern Counties League.

On Wednesday 28th April 1976, Bury Town played their final match at the historic Kings Road ground when West Ham United were the visitors. 1,750 watched on as the sides drew 2-2, and a pitch invasion signalled the end of the Blues spiritual home.

It was another two years before the club had a permanent home, with the proposed new ground at Ram Meadow under construction. During this time the club were forced to play home matches on a local heath with a blanket collection before each game the only source of income and the club was in very real danger of ceasing to exist.

Thankfully the new home at Ram Meadow was completed and opened in 1978 and was celebrated with a visit from FA Cup holders Ipswich Town who paraded the trophy around the pitch before the opening game.

The Club stayed in the Eastern Counties League from 1976 to 1987. During this period the Club set the Ram Meadow record attendance when they took on Enfield FC in the 4th Qualifying Round Replay of the FA Cup. 2,500 packed into the ground with many more outside. The ground was creaking at the seams as Enfield won 1-0 to progress.

The Blues were promoted back to the Southern League for the 1987-88 season after finishing 3rd in the Eastern Counties League. Despite a promising first few seasons, the Club struggled at this level, finishing bottom of the Southern Division in 1992-93 and 1993-94. In 1995, the Club swapped placed with Forest Green Rovers to move into the Midland Division, but fortunes did not favour any better and the club were relegated back to the Eastern Counties League for the 1995-96 season.

After some early seasons of struggle, the Club turned the corner with the appointment of former Colchester United captain Richard Wilkins. He led the club to consecutive runners-up spots in 2004-05 and 2005-06 and also the Semi Final of the FA Vase, narrowly going out over two legs to Hillingdon Borough.

At the end of the 2005-06 season, the Clubs board decided to accept promotion to the Isthmian Football League for the first time in the club's history. They entered in the newly reorganised Division One North and spent two seasons' there before an FA re-organisation saw the Club moved to the Southern League for their third spell of membership.

It was during this spell that the Club reached the FA Cup First Round Proper for the second time in its history, progressing through five qualifying rounds before bowing out at Alfreton Town.

The 2009-10 season saw the Blues storm to the Southern League Midland Division championship recording 102 points and with it promotion to the Premier Division of the Isthmian League, clinching the title at home on the final day of the season in front of 1,550 spectators against Marlow FC.

The Club enjoyed a successful start to life at Step 3 in the Isthmian League and finished 3rd in 2010-11 season and 5th in the 2011-12 season, qualifying for the end of season Play Off's on both occasions, but losing to Lowestoft Town and AFC Hornchurch respectively.

The 2011-12 season saw the Club pick up honours in the form of the Isthmian League Challenge Cup, defeating the now defunct East Thurrock United 1-0 in the final at Staines Town Wheatsheaf Park.

The Club spent a total of 5 seasons in the Isthmian Premier Division and won the Suffolk County FA Premier Cup on three occasions in 2010-11, 2012-13 and 2013-14 before relegation in the 2014-15 season, with the side placed back in Division One North.

For the past 9 seasons, the club have competed in the Isthmian Division One North. Despite some encouraging seasons, the Club did not come close to a return to step 3 until the appointment of former professional Cole Skuse, who led the club to runners up spot in the 2023-24 season, but the Club were defeated in the play-offs by Brentwood Town.

The 2024-25 season saw the club again reach the Isthmian League play off's, defeating Waltham Abbey 4-0 in the semi-final and then a dramatic 93rd minute winner from Ed Upson saw the Blues clinch promotion with a 1-0 win over Brightlingsea Regent in front of 2,136.

### **Bury Town - Profiles**

COLE SKUSE – MANAGER: A former professional who made 615 league appearances for Bristol City, Ipswich Town and Colchester United. Now in his third season as the manager at Ram Meadow, having led the club to promotion to the Southern Premier Division Central last season with a dramatic play off final victory.

PAUL MUSGROVE – ASSISTANT MANAGER: Paul joined with Cole Skuse and is now into his third season with the Blues. Previously a manager at Stowmarket Town and Walsham-Le-Willows, he has an extensive knowledge of the local scene and lead Stowmarket to the Isthmian League play offs in their first season in the division.

CHARLIE BECKWITH D.O.B 14/01/2000: Goalkeeper who joined in October 2023 from Thurlow Nunn League side Lakenheath where he won both the Suffolk Senior Cup and Thurlow Nunn League Cup. Has previous experience at step 3 with Leiston and missed just one game on our way to promotion last season.

HARLEY CURTIS D.O.B 09-02-2003: Harley joined the Blues in February 2025 from Ipswich Wanderers where he was dual registered with Leiston. A product of the Ipswich Town academy, he joined National League side Chesterfield on a one-year contract for the 2023-24 before heading back to Suffolk and Needham Market for the start of 2024-25.

JOE CARROLL D.O.B 02-10-2003: Joe joined from Stowmarket Town in January 2024 having joined them from AFC Sudbury. Joe is a strong defender with a great turn of pace who likes to burst forward, and with a giant throw in, he can cause all types of problems for defences. Sat out last season with an injury but is back and ready to go for 2025-26.

ALLY CONWAY D.O.B 22-12-1998: Ally joined the club in the summer of 2025 from Newmarket Town. The attacking minded midfielder had joined the Jockeys from Cambridge City and scored 16 goals to earn them promotion to the Isthmian League in 2024 but opted to make the short move up the A14 in the summer to join us at step 3.

JOSH CURRY D.O.B 24-11-1992: Josh joined the Blues ahead of the 2023-24 season from Stowmarket Town. He was with our youth system before going onto play for Lowestoft Town and Stowmarket Town. Captained the side to the play offs for the first time in 10 years in 2023-24 before going one better last season and seeing the side to promotion.

MIKEY DAVIS D.O.B 05-10-1999: Joined in the summer of 2024 from Cambridge City. Mikey was with EFL side Grimsby Town as a scholar but after leaving the Mariners he joined both Haverhill club, initially playing for Borough and then to Rovers. His performances prompted higher level Cambridge City to sign him in November 2018.

TOMMY HUGHES D.O.B 28-10-2000: Tommy joined Bury Town from King's Lynn Town in the summer of 2025. Made 71 appearances for the Linnets between 2023-25 in the National League North but returns to Ram Meadow having previously had a short loan spell with us in 2018 from the Ipswich Town academy, making 5 appearances. Has also spent time on loan at Torquay United.

RYAN JOLLAND D.O.B 20-09-1996: 27-year-old midfielder who started out with the Ipswich Town academy before joining our partnership academy at West Suffolk College. Ryan has now gone on to serve the club for 10 years and play an important part in regaining our step 3 status.

MAX MAUGHN D.O.B 26-06-2001: Max is now into his 6<sup>th</sup> year with the club, having joined in the summer of 2019 after being released by Colchester United. Over the years he has gone on to become a mainstay of the team, an exciting midfielder who is popular with the fans, who creates plenty of chances with his pace down the wing.

ETHAN MAYHEW D.O.B 27-02-2002: Ethan joined the club from Hadleigh United of the Thurlow Nunn League in the summer of 2023. A highly rated prospect who was a product of the AFC Sudbury

academy, who has gone on to establish himself in our midfield over the last three seasons.

LEWIS O'MALLEY D.O.B 06-11-2001: Lewis joined from local rivals AFC Sudbury in July 2022, having captained their side to the first round of the FA Cup. A tough defender who is one of the first names on the team sheet each week.

TAYLOR PARR D.O.B 18-12-1993: Primarily playing as a centre half, Taylor was with Cambridge United as a youth player before playing two seasons at Royston Town. He then spent 3 seasons as part of a successful St Neots Town side before making a move back to Royston Town. He moved to Cambridge City in 2021 and spent three years with them, making 107 appearances and scoring 14 goals before joining us in the summer of 2024.

GEORGE QUANTRELL: D.O.B 30-08-2002: George joined in the summer of 2025 from fellow Southern League Premier Division side Leiston. He scored 20 goals from an attacking midfield position last season but this season opted to join us at Ram Meadow and will be looking to perform similar this season.

CEMAL RAMADAN D.O.B 02-01-1997: Cemal has led our forward line for the best part of 10 years, having made his debut on loan from Ipswich Town in November 2015, scoring away at Waltham Abbey. Spent the next season away before rejoining permanently in the summer of 2017 and has now gone on to score over 150 goals for the club. Cemal has been our leading goal scorer for the past six seasons in a row.

JOE WHITE D.O.B 17-10-1996: Joe has been with the club for 10 years now, having worked his way up through to youth system after being with Ipswich Town at a young age. A well-respected toughtackling defender who has been loyal to his hometown club for a number of years.

The last match between the sides was very significant for Rovers as it was their last ever home league match on 17th April 2010. Champions-elect Bury Town of the Zamaretto League Midland Division romped to an emphatic 4 - 0 victory in front of a crowd of 353.


