Good afternoon everybody and welcome to our match today against Kettering Town and after the recent cold snap I hope that the weather has warmed up a little.

I'll start with last Saturday's game against Stourbridge that is probably the maddest and closest game we have had since I took over as manager last year. Needless to say that I was more than pleased to go in at halftime 2 - 0 and with the advantage of playing with an extra man. But that all changed early in the second half when we were also down to ten with Aaron's Roberts unfortunate red card. They scored from the resulting free-kick and to be

fair a "wonder" goal. That seemed to give them momentum and they went 3 -2 up. I felt that we were going to lose the match but thanks to Kobe Hall for striking a fine penalty to give us a point that I thought we deserved.

Going on to Tuesday and losing 3 - 0 to Banbury United was disappointing particularly after beating them by the same scoreline here at the UK Electrical Stadium a month or so ago. Although they deserved the win, the scoreline flattered them a little. We might have got one back in the latter stages of the game but it was not to be.

## From The Archives, 6 Years Ago

Saturday 23rd November 2019 - 3:00 p.m. kick-off, The Southern League Premier Division Central

#### Bromsgrove Sporting 3 (2) St Ives Town 2 (1) at the Victoria Ground

Two goals from hotshot striker Mikey Taylor helped guide Bromsgrove Sporting to a 3-2 win over St. Ives Town.

A well struck Taylor effort from close range opened the scoring four minutes in, before Cameron McWilliams tapped into an empty net to equalise six minutes later.

A Harry Higginson header gave Bromsgrove the lead soon after, but St. Ives would once again level, five minutes into the second half, courtesy of a well struck penalty by Robert Parker.

The winner would come seven minutes from time, as Taylor neatly powered home with aplomb past keeper Shay Griffiths.

The game got off to the best possible start for Sporting, as a ball from Greg Mills into the box was well kept in by Will Shorrock, who teed up Taylor, allowing him to emphatically slam the ball into the roof of the net.

However, St. Ives were level just moments later, as McWilliams shook off full back Jack Wilson and tapped home into a virtually empty net, with Higginson unable to clear with a last-ditch effort.

The action came thick and fast, with Leon Broadhurst sent off for a supposedly rash challenge on the quarter hour mark, although it did look harsh on the Sporting centre back.

The home side regained the lead 20 minutes in, as a cracking corner from Mills was headed in well by Higginson, with Griffiths unable to keep it out with the hand he got to it.

Shaquille McDonald and Shorrock had chances to extend the lead towards the back end of the first half, whilst Shorrock had a shot well saved by Griffiths early in the second 45.

Thomas Wood almost scored for St Ives in the 49th minute, but the leveller would come just 60 seconds later; Wilson was adjudged to have brought down George Bailey in the box, with Parker burying the subsequent spot-kick nicely into the bottom corner.

Taylor had a header from close to the far post blocked away by a defender, whilst Matthew Foy capped off a fine team move for St. Ives with a shot on goal that was struck straight at Sporting stopper Daniel Platt.

The 83rd minute saw the game's final goal - Taylor got onto a ball from Natham Hayward, allowing him to run at goal. His attempted pass to McDonald ricocheted back into his path, which resulted in him dispatching the ball home with aplomb.

Bromsgrove Manager Bren Kelly expressed his happiness at the victory: "It was a topsy-turvy game but the effort the lads put in was huge, so I'm delighted for them."

Disappointed St. Ives manager Ricky Marheineke said: "It's a tough one to take. We definitely didn't deserve to win the game but playing against 10-men for so long, we definitely would have expected to have taken a point."







#### Club Bans Micro Pads After 'Unbearable' Injury to Forward

Non-league Ilfracombe Town have banned 'micro' shin pads after forward Riley Malin suffered an "unbearable" double-leg break in a South West Peninsula League match at the weekend.

While there are currently no plans to ban the use of the pads, the Football Association says the use of 'mini' shin pads has the potential to "increase the risk of injury".

Ilfracombe Town's fixture at Bridport on Saturday was abandoned after Martin broke his fibula and tibia during a 50-50 challenge with the home goalkeeper.

"The initial sound of it was unbearable. It was like a shotgun going off," Ilfracombe Town chairman Nick Jupp told BBC Radio 5 Live.

"There is no blame on Riley at all for wearing micro shin pads but I think if he had more coverage on the shin area with bigger shin pads, the injury could have been less than it was."

While shin guards are mandatory under the laws of the game, the rules around them are vague.

They currently state that pads must be covered entirely by socks, made of a suitable material (rubber, plastic or similar) and provide a reasonable degree of protection.

Law 4.2 states that shin pads must:

- Be made of a suitable material
- Be of an appropriate size to provide reasonable protection and be covered by the socks
- And players are responsible for the size and suitability of their shin pads

Further FA guidance, external says: "The amount of shin physically covered is an important consideration, as any part of the shin that is not covered is not as well protected.

"'Micro' or 'mini' shin pads may therefore increase the risk of injury due to the smaller amount of shin covered compared to larger sized shin pads.

"We advise that when considering the protection offered by shin pads, safety is prioritised by ensuring a good proportion of the shin area is covered and

therefore protected."

The International Football Association Board (Ifab), football's lawmaker, has been contacted for comment.

Ifab has previously said it has no plans to change the rule and stressed that players - or the parents or guardians of youth players - must take responsibility for their own safety on the pitch.

"Players' legs are all different sizes and there are so many different materials," a spokesperson said.

"Ifab's view is that this is the responsibility of the individual player and not the referee. Where young players are concerned, that responsibility [should be taken by the coach, parents or guardians]."



Professional football players have been seen wearing small shin pads. Image: Getty Images In a statement, Ilfracombe Town said they have now prohibited "the use of micro shin pads across all age groups and squads, from youth teams through to senior teams".

#### Ilfracombe's stance has support

They added: "This decision has been made in the interest of player safety and welfare, and to ensure that all players are equipped with protective gear that meets required safety standards."

They are not the first club to follow this course of action.

Penistone Church in Barnsley and a number of others cross the lower reaches of the game have taken similar decisions and support their stance.

Club chairman Jupp added: "I think clubs need to look closely at player welfare and safety regarding these micro shin pads. The support we've had on social media so far is unbelievable.

## Today's Visitors - Kettering Town - Club History

Kettering Town were originally formed in 1872, turning professional in 1891. The club graduated through twelve different leagues from 1892 until they became founding members of the Alliance Premier League in 1979. The club maintained its status in the top flight of semi-professional football until the 2000–01 season.

Many honours have found their way to Rockingham Road, winning the Midland Football League title in 1896 and 1900. The Southern League Championship was won on three occasions by the club, in 1928 and 1957 under Tommy Lawton and in 1973 under guidance of Ron Atkinson. In the 1930s the club won the East Midlands League and in 1948

the Poppies became Birmingham League Champions.

the

In a Southern League game against Bath City on 24 January 1976, Kettering became the first British club to play with a sponsor's name printed on their shirts after signing a deal with local firm Kettering Tyres. The deal was brokered by chief executive and manager Derek Dougan. Four days later, The Football Association ordered the club to remove the slogan, but Dougan changed the words on the shirts to "Kettering T" and claimed that the T stood for "Town". Nonetheless, the FA ordered the club to remove the words, which the club did due to the threat of a £1,000 fine. Shirt sponsorship was eventually legalised within the English game in 1977. Kettering are also the first ever British team to have their initials on their ground's floodlights.

The club finished runners-up in the Football Conference in 1981, 1989, 1994 and 1998. The GMAC Cup, (the non-league, league Cup) was won in 1987 and the Poppies were runners-up in 1995, then known as the Bob Lord Trophy. County competitions have been won regularly by Kettering Town, with the Northants Senior Cup won on 28 occasions and the Maunsell Cup 13 times.

The FA Cup has brought success and publicity to Rockingham Road with the first-round proper being reached on 41 occasions. In 1901 the club reached the last sixteen and in more modern times the Poppies reached the fourth-round proper in the 1988–89 season and the third round in 1991–92 only to lose to Kenny Dalglish's Blackburn Rovers. During the 1994–95 season the club made their debut live on Sky TV in a first-round tie against Plymouth Argyle, soon followed by another appearance against Wrexham at Rockingham Road. As of 2013 (June) the Poppies had scored more goals than any other team in the FA Cup history, with 846 goals scored.

Wembley has been reached on two occasions before. The Poppies lost 2–0 to Stafford Rangers in the 1979 FA Trophy Final. More recently, the FA Trophy Final in 2000 saw the Poppies lose a closely fought final with Kingstonian 3–2.

Most recently, the club were narrowly relegated on the last day of the 2000–01 season which ended 30 years in the top flight of non-league football. The Poppies made a quick return to the Conference in the 2001/02 season winning the Southern Football League with a last-day victory at Tiverton Town under Carl Shutt, his first full season in charge.

Season 2005–06 was to be one of massive change at Rockingham Road. In October 2005 it was announced that long-serving Chairman Peter Mallinger was to hand over the reins to a consortium consisting of Imraan Ladak, Mick Leech and England legend Paul Gascoigne. Gascoigne was installed as manager, replacing Kevin Wilson, and ex-Arsenal stalwart Paul Davis was recruited as assistant manager.

The eyes of the world were on Gascoigne and the Poppies, and media interest was massive. However, for a variety of reasons, Gascoigne was only to remain in the job for thirty-nine days. Kevin Wilson was given his old job back but only held onto it for two months as a run of one win in twelve games saw the Poppies slump into the bottom half of Conference North.

Chairman Imraan Ladak installed former Tamworth manager Mark Cooper as the new Kettering Town manager for the 2007–08 campaign. The club finished the season as Conference North champions, breaking several records along the way (including seven consecutive wins at the start of the season, 29 wins overall, and a divisional record of 97 points). As a result, the club was promoted to the Conference National.

In the 2008–09 season, Kettering Town beat Lincoln City, Notts County and Eastwood Town to reach the fourth round of the FA Cup, where they faced Fulham at home. While twice pulling even with the Premier League squad and looking like they could possibly produce a draw late in the second half, they gave up two goals and ultimately lost the spirited match, 4–2.

Creditable finishes were achieved in the Blue Square Bet Premier League, until a disastrous move in 2011 from

Kettering to Nene Park, the former home of Rushden and Diamonds, saw the Club in financial turmoil and relegation of two divisions followed a bottom of the table finish and the declaration of a CVA.

In February 2012 George Rolls took over control of the club from Imraan Ladak, although Rolls wasn't officially the Kettering Town owner, he was involved in the day to day running of the club and John Beck was appointed manager. On the 6th June 2012, George Rolls was suspended from football for five years after breaches of Football Association betting laws were proven, Rolls was also fined £10,000, and this led to the appointment of Ritchie Jeune as Chairman.

In September 2012, Imraan Ladak the owner of the Club assumed the role of Interim Chairman after a dispute. John Beck who had been appointed as Manager in June 2012 was asked to leave the premises just before a game against Bashley on 6th October. On 8th October, the lights were switched off at Nene Park and several games were postponed by the Southern League in order that the Club could find new investors. On 10th November 2012, Kettering recommenced their fixtures by playing Redditch United at Corby's Steel Park with Alan Doyle as Caretaker Manager. Volunteers, led by Northampton businessman Ritchie Jeune, ran the Club in the absence of the majority shareholder and Director with the support of the Kettering Town (Poppies) Supporters Trust.

Thomas Baillie, the former head of the Youth set up, took over as Manager in February 2013 with Alan Doyle becoming Football Technical Director, and the experienced Dean Thomas arrived to become Assistant Manager. The inevitable relegation followed another season of turmoil and the club was placed in the Southern League Division One Central, with Dean Thomas assuming the Manager's role and Thomas Baillie reverting to become Assistant Manager. The Poppies moved again to Latimer Park ground sharing with Burton Park Wanderers.

After a disappointing start to the 2013-14 Kettering whose Chairman was now Ritchie Jeune, went on a record 21 game unbeaten league run, following that up with 10 consecutive victories (9 in the league) in April to create a National record, ending the season in third place just, 2 points behind Champions Dunstable Town and losing to Slough Town in the Calor League Division One Central Play-off final in front of 2,331 at Latimer Park, the club's most successful season in the last four campaigns. Sensationally though Dean Thomas stood down as manager of the club in mid-May 2014, leaving his assistant Thomas Baillie to return as joint manager along with Scott Machin.

The combination of the joint managers reaped the benefits from the previous season as the 2014-15 Evo-Stik Southern League Division One Central Championship was won in style, at their first attempt, winning the division by 11 points. But the club wanted a sole manager for the 2015-16 season, Tom Baillie soon resigned and after that shock so did Scott Machin, paving the way for the return of Marcus Law to become the club's 57th manager. Marcus steered the club to 6th position in the Evo-Stik Premier missing out on the play-offs by just one point. In 2016-17 the club finished in 9th place while winning the Northamptonshire Hillier Senior Cup (for the first time since 2001) in a thrilling final against rivals Corby Town at Sixfields, Northampton.

The 2018-19 season saw manager Marcus Law guide the Poppies to the Evo-Stik League South Premier Central title, winning the league by a massive 14 points and promotion back to the Conference North. But Marcus resigned his position in June 2019, paving the way for former Poppy Nicky Eaden, to guide the club in the Vanarama National League North for the 2019-20 campaign. After 11 league games with just two wins and an FA Cup exit against Sutton Coldfield Town, Nicky Eaden was sacked. Former Poppy and ex-Eastwood Town, Mansfield Town, Torquay United, Barrow and Guiseley manager Paul Cox was appointed in October with the Poppies bottom of the league!

Cox transformed the Poppies fortunes and was well on course to finish in a respectable league position until the Covid-19 pandemic forced the season to end null and void with only 31 of the 42 games played, final positions were decided on a points per game ratio. The following 2020-21 season was even shorter, just 14 games for the Poppies, as financial implications due to the continued restrictions on fans in the ground, lockdown and the Covid-19 pandemic, again made the season null & void after a vote in the National League North to discontinue (well the majority of clubs) the campaign.

Paul Cox embarked on the 2021-22 season, technically having not managed a game for the club despite being at the club for almost two seasons! But with the club in mid-table Cox's tenure during his first full season lasted until Friday January 21st 2020, a day before our game away at Bradford (Park Avenue), when it was announced he and his staff had resigned to join rivals Boston United.

The club wasted no time in appointing a successor as former Kings Lynn Town guru, Ian Culverhouse was

appointed as the 60th Kettering Town manager, along with former Poppies goalkeeper Paul Bastock as his assistant and coach Joe Simpson. They continued and improved the club's form with the Poppies finishing 8th in the Vanarama National League North. Only engaged until the end of the season it was a surprise though that Culverhouse and his staff left the club two weeks later.

The search for a new manager began and in mid-May former Nottingham Forest and Port Vale star Lee Glover was appointed as the Poppies 61st manager since 1922 for the onset of the 2022-23 season. But a disappointing season with just 3 players on the books when he arrived, Lee built a squad that ultimately saw relegation on the final Saturday of the season when safety a few weeks earlier seemed most likely.

Lee left the club in May by mutual consent. The club prior to Lee's departure saw long term chairman and owner Ritchie Jeune leave the club as a new owner was sought after.

The 2023-24 season saw Poppies in the Southern League Premier Central with Andy Leese being appointed as the new manager, Again, he only had 4 players at his disposal at the start of his tenure at the club, so the rebuilding began. But a poor start to the season saw the Poppies in the relegation zone, after 21 games Andy was replaced with his assistant and former player Jim Le Masurier, first in an interim capacity and then appointed as manager. After a promising start he in turn took a step back in February and became part of new manager Richard Lavery's backroom team. 'Lavs' was no stranger to the club being part of Marcus Law's, (his assistant), in the title winning side in 2018-19. He steered the club away from relegation, winning 5 consecutive league games, with 4 games to spare as the rebuild for the 2024-25 began in earnest.

In May 2024, after 12 dramatic seasons legendary club owner Ritchie Jenue sold Kettering Town Football Club to Nadim (George) Akhtar, a new era began. It was a great first season for the club, getting to the FA Cup 2nd round for the 17th time after dispatching Northampton Town 2-1 at Sixfields in front of millions around the world watching on BBC TV in the first round. A heart-breaking Play-off final defeat at the hands of AFC Telford United at Latimer Park saw the end of the Poppies campaign after finishing the regular season runners-up, in a tightly fought contest with eventual Champions Bedford Town.

It was all change in the summer 2025, with the surprise departure of manager Richard Lavery and the majority of the 2024-25 squad. Former Banbury United manager Simon Hollyhead was appointed in July becoming the 65th different manager of the Club and so began his task of shaping a squad for the 2025-26 campaign. After a promising start winning the first 4 games fortunes changed dramatically with league defeats and early exits from both the FA Cup and FA Trophy, top players leaving the club, Simon resigned after just 13 games.

The search for another manager began, with former Poppy Liam McDonald being appointed becoming the 66th manager and 12th different since the Poppies arrived at Latimer Park since 2013. Liam's first task was to resurrect the fortunes of the squad who were in mid-table obscurity.

#### **Kettering Town - Profiles**

#### MANAGER - LIAM McDONALD

Worcester born Liam was appointed manager of Kettering Town in late October 2025 after the departure of Simon Hollyhead. He is no stranger to the club having played for the Poppies under Marcus Law during the 2010-11 season.

#### ASSISTANT MANAGER - NICK GREEN

Nick is a former Poppy having played for the club during the 2010-11 season. He had previously played for Aston Villa, Stourbridge Swifts, RC Warwick, Quorn and Barwell.

#### ASSISTANT COACH/ANALYST - TERRY THOMPSON

Terry is a former semi-professional player in the Scottish non leagues. He started coach education pathway with the Scottish Football Association during covid, gaining experience working from youth teams through to first team at Scottish Championship level.

#### LEAD STRENGTH & CONDITIONING COACH - SHOHEIB EBRAHIM

Shoheib has extensive experience, knowledge and practical application of strength and conditioning practices to optimise player performance and minimise injury risk the majority of which was gained at his three seasons whilst at Mansfield Town FC.

JASON ALEXANDER - Goalkeeper (b 22:08:88)

Jason returned to the Poppies in early August after an injury to Paul White. Jason's return to Latimer Park saw an impressive 3-0 win over Leiston with another good display from the big man.

LEVI ANDOH – Defender (b 12:03:00)

Levi was born in Amsterdam (Netherlands) before moving to England aged 6. Joined the Poppies during pre-season as the Poppies strengthened their defensive unit. Levi is a tall powerful versatile defender with strength and pace.

PRESTON BITEMO - Midfield (b 14:11:05)

Preston joined the Poppies in early November on loan from Hereford. The youngster who impressed the Bulls also played for Hinckley AFC. He joins the Poppies in transition as manager Liam McDonald begins to stamp his authority on the season.

JAMES CLIFTON - Forward (b 28:11:91)

James returns to Latimer Park on loan from Spalding United having previously played for the Poppies in 2013-14, making 65 appearances, scoring 9 goals in two seasons, winning a title with Kettering before moving to Nuneaton Town.

LEWIS COYLE - Defender (b 09:08:94)

Lewis was a Liam McDonald signing in early November on loan from Bedford Town. Prior to his time with the Eagles, the experienced defender spent 5 seasons with Oxford City.

ISMAEL FATADJO - Winger (b 23:06:00)

Ismael was born in Portugal and joined the Poppies in the closed season from Leiston, having previously played for Wroxham, Kings Lynn Town and Gorleston (on loan from the Linnets).

KAI FIFIELD - Midfield (b 14:07:03)

Kai joined the Poppies during pre-season in 2024. He previously played for Wantage Town, Wellingborough Whitworths, Beaconsfield U23 and St Ives Town.

SHANE FLYNN - Left Back (b14:10:01)

Shane joined the Poppies in July 2025 after impressing during pre-season. The former Bray Wanderers, Leicester City Academy defender who played for the Foxes Premier League 2 side and U18's before joining Waterford and Ballymena United (Ireland).

GEORGE FORSYTH - Central midfield (b 04:12:98)

George re-joined the Poppies during the 2025-26 closed season from Banbury United. He has previously played for Bromsgrove Sporting, Hereford, Halesowen Town, Hednesford Town, Stourbridge, Worcester City, Kidderminster Harriers, AFC Telford United and Banbury United.

WILL GLENNON – Midfield / Central defender (b 02:01:03)

Will joined the Poppies in early August from Bedford Town. The dynamic midfield / central defender is no stranger to Latimer Park having scored two goals last season in St Ives Town 3-2 win

ALFIE LEWIS - Midfield (b 28:09:99)

Alfie is a product of the West Ham United academy and was part of the Hammers first team squad, without making a first-class appearance. He went on loan from West Ham to St Patrick's Athletic, of the League of Ireland Premier before joining them full-time.

EDIMOND OPPONG - Winger (b 13:04:05)

Eddy joined the Poppies in July having impressed during pre-season, the fleet footed pacy winger with a lethal left foot, has previously played for Union EuroCalcio (Italy), Middlesbrough U21,

Belper Town and Mickleover FC.

RYAN MONGA - Forward (b 08:07:05)

Ryan, a young forward previously played for Nuneaton Borough and currently is a coach at the CP (Callum Powell) Academy. He made his first-class debut against Quorn FC having previously played for the Poppies in the Northants Senior Cup.

CALLUM POWELL – Forward (b 28:01:96)

Callum returned to Kettering Town in December 2024 from Braintree Town, having previously played for the Poppies during the 2020-21 & 2021-22 seasons.

BLAINE ROWE – Right back (b 22:03:02)

Blaine joined the Poppies in late October linking up with former manager Liam McDonald from their time at Stourbridge.

CONNOR STANLEY - Winger (b 30:12:01)

Connor is an exciting winger who joined the Poppies from Banbury United during the closed season. He was a product of the Birmingham City and Manchester United youth academies which included a Europa League squad place while at United.

ANDI THANOJ – Central midfielder (b 19:12:92)

Andi is a former Albanian U21 international born in Tirana. He is a midfielder who has previously played for Grimsby Town, Alfreton Town, Harrogate Town, Redditch United and a 6-year spell at Boston United before joining Coalville Town.

PAUL WHITE – Goalkeeper (b 11:10:94)

Paul originally signed for the Poppies in 2016, going on to make 159 appearances keeping 52 clean sheets, a very impressive statistic.

KAI WILLIAMS – Forward (b 17:04:97)

Kai joined the club in late October and became manager Liam McDonald's first signing for the Poppies, as he looked to rejuvenate the forward line.

WES YORK - Defensive midfielder (b 10:05:93)

Wes joined the Poppies during the 2024-25 closed season from Coalville Town. Wes's career began at Anstey Nomads, before spells at Nuneaton Borough, Wrexham, Gateshead, York City and Brackley Town.

#### The Record against Kettering

Since joining the Southern League Premier Division Central in season 2023/4, Kettering Town have played Sporting four times. In that season, The Poppies won 2-1 at the Victoria Ground with 724 spectators in attendance. The match at Latimer Park finished 1 - 1 with 541 present.

Last season was a 2 - 1 win for Kettering with 571 in attendance. Sporting won the reverse fixture by the same scoreline but with a larger crowd of 1,124. In that match, the opener came 24 minutes in, as a cracker of a cross from Lycett was headed in from close range by King. The lead was doubled two minutes later by Jamie Soule. Kettering halved the deficit in the 56th minute, as Ben Hart capped off a decent team move with an authoritative drive into the net.

RADCLIFFE joint-boss Anthony Johnson's recent social media post caught the eye.

Highlighting their three goalscorers, Jordan Hulme, Rio Clegg and Mikey Afuye Johnson pointed out their upbringing through local amateur football to the positions where they were used to putting up the nets and paying subs.

His message to youngsters is to not turn noses up at lower levels, but get out and play competitive men's football.

 $Those \ three \ are \ now \ spear heading \ Radcliffe's \ National \ League \ North \ campaign \ that \ has \ got \ off \ to \ a \ flyer.$ 

It's interesting as a reminder to young aspiring footballers there are many ways to make a career in football. Playing - and being paid - to play part-time at such a good level doesn't happen by accident. It takes hard work and dedication to achieve.

It's true there are some youngsters who may sneer at Non-League. Stories of some turning down the chance to go on loan to help with their development do float around.

Perhaps it's the social media culture where it's easier to have 'professional footballer' written in the X or Instagram bio. But for those who do play, there are more opportunities than ever to make an impact and get spotted.

In recent seasons we've written about so many stories of players getting their chance in the Football League who are not drawn just from the top of Non-League, but right the way through all Steps.

"Let's use those (Hulme, Clegg and Afuye) as an example," Johnsons told us. "Rio Clegg has never been hurt by the system. Because he's never come through an academy, he's never been released by a Liverpool, United, Blackburn and landed at, say, an Oldham and had to start again.

"That leaves a lot of scar tissue, it does. I see it with young players we coach now - eight, nine, ten year olds who have been told they're not good enough - and people wonder why there's a pandemic of young lads with mental health!

"We've got Rio Clegg, Mikey Afuye and a whole group of that age around the club where we can go: They're starving hungry.

"Then when you've got a Jordan Hulme, who has come from the exact same playground as them, put nets up and, it sounds awful, cleared dog s\*\*t off the local park pitch, paid subs to then getting to paid to play semi-professional football, shows how far they've come.

"Yes, you've got young hungry lads coming through but you've also got lads at the top end who have been there and done it themselves. That helps keep their feet on the ground.


"We've got a group here - Matt Sargent, Danny Greenfield, Michael Afuye and Rio Clegg - who are all 23, 24, being watched by EFL clubs and they're an incredibly talented bunch.

"Then we've got the group above them who are coming into their prime. Then we've got our experienced group. It's almost three categories so we've got a really good blend."
