#### Saturday 1st November 2014 - 3:00 p.m. kick-off, F.A. Vase - Round 1

#### Bromsgrove Sporting (3)3 Nuneaton Griff (1)2

The Rouslers progressed to the 2nd Round of the F.A. Vase at the expense of Nuneaton Griff thanks mainly to a three-goal burst in 15 minutes at the end of the first half.

The visitors started the game strongly and quickly had Bromsgrove on the back foot, twice hitting the woodwork in the first 5 minutes. In the first minute Aden Moore's shot was tipped onto the post by Jake Bedford and then a low drive from Jack Colley hit the base of the right-hand post from the edge of the area a couple of minutes later.

The Griff took the lead on 15 minutes when they scythed through a motionless home defence and Adam Russell found Moore in acres of space in the area to give Bedford no chance from 12 yards.

This cajoled the home side into life and after Sam Wills had hit the side netting after great approach play by Will Tibbetts, they equalised on the half hour when Sean Brain netted from close range after Aaron Daniels had forced his way into the left-hand side of the area and delivered a perfect cross.

Bromsgrove were almost ahead within seconds of the restart Brain crossing for fellow striker Daniels to hit the post. The home team continued to press hard, and they took the lead on 40 minutes when a Reece Hewitt finished a strong run into the area with a pinpoint cross that Tibbetts head past a stranded Alex Horton.

The Nuneaton 'keeper was fortunate to escape with only a yellow card on the stroke of half time when he brought down livewire Brain from an accurate Hewitt pass. The penalty was struck by Tibbetts at the right height for Horton to make a save to his right, but the Sporting player made amends seconds later when he extended Bromsgrove's lead with a header from Brain's cross just before the interval.

The visitors scored on 53 minutes to reduce the deficit to a solitary goal when Moore scored his second with a low shot after great work by Jack Colley.

The remainder of the half was an entertaining affair, most of the chances falling to Bromsgrove who were deprived from extending their lead by poor shot selection and some decent saves by Horton. Bedford was never seriously tested by Nuneaton as the Bromsgrove defence were not really further troubled

At the final whistle Sporting Supporters were singing "We're on our way to Wembley"; it's a mere 6 further victories away.





# Cathedrals of capital: Europe's stadium arms race escalates As Barcelona's revamped Spotify Camp Nou begins to reopen, the game's new temples promise both grandeur and gridlock



One day next month, part of the upgraded 'Spotify Camp Nou' will open in Barcelona as the architectural arms race of European football stadiums intensifies.

The new grounds of the biggest clubs are competing for scale, grandeur, naming rights and what used to be called turnstile cash. Barcelona travel to Real Madrid for the Clasico last weekend knowing their claim to inhabit the game's largest cathedral will be restored in stages after two years in temporary accommodation at the Olympic Stadium.

The Santiago Bernabeu, which will host them, was refurbished with a wraparound skin to become a more fitting luxury entertainment centre. Gone were the echoes of the Puskás and Di Stéfano era, the salty taste of Madrid life the old Bernabeu evoked.

This week Barcelona's treasurer Ferran Olive admitted they should have started the Camp Nou's reconstruction "years ago," adding, "we're late."

La Liga's house envy can be traced in part to Europe's paranoia about the financial dominance of England's Premier League. Status anxiety, commercial mega-partnerships and gigantism are also driving competition in the 60,000-100,000 seat range. In an increasingly Americanised sport, you can trace the construction template as well to the major US cities.

If 'Spotify Camp Nou' sounds all wrong, it's here to stay. A club that recoiled at shirt sponsorships before making an exception for Unicef went full download in 2022 on a colossal deal with the music streamer. With the refurb, the club expects annual stadium revenue to rise on completion in 2027 from £151m now to £347m. The final phase is a kind of Barcelona heresy: a full roof.

While Valencia have a third go at selling the historic Mestalla, Inter and AC Milan prepare to shed the skin of the San Siro for a new 71,500-seat amphitheatre in time for the 2032 European Championship. It's not just Spain and England in the grip of a building frenzy.

Here at home, Everton's Hill Dickinson Stadium is the latest architectural behemoth. When it opened in 2006 with 60,704 vantage points, Arsenal's Emirates Stadium satisfied the dreams of the most ambitious Islingtonian. Now, there is talk of the team relocating to Wembley for a rebuild that would add 10,000 places and take the Emirates into the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium modernity league.

In Manchester, United's fantasy is a 100,000-seat arena with a mini-city wrapped around it, with an estimated £2bn cost. Urban regeneration is the go-to spin for clubs chasing local authority help and even central government funding. Manchester City are also pressing on with a £300m expansion of the Etihad Stadium from 53,400 to 60,000 seats.

Another club in nation state ownership, Newcastle, are trying to decide whether to redevelop St James' Park or start afresh at Leazes Park. Reported uncertainty over how much the club's Saudi owners would be willing to invest in construction makes this one a slow burner.

In London, Stamford Bridge's 42,000 capacity has long tormented Chelsea. They want 60,000 places (that magic minimum number again) but remain stuck in the bind of whether to redevelop 'the Bridge' or build a new ground nearby. Either option would be hideously expensive.

Fans of all these clubs will feel both awe and dread. Awe, because the Evertonian flavour of Goodison Park was consigned to history faster than predicted when supporters drank in the Hill Dickinson's splendour. Nostalgia for what White Hart Lane represented was set aside when fans began gathering in what feels like a giant outdoor business class lounge.

The dread kicks in when regulars at the biggest grounds try to get there or get away after the match - an under-reported trial of the spirit. The derision heaped on those who leave before the end ignores their understandable urge to avoid heading to a train station at 10pm at the same time as 60.000 others.

When they were built, the new homes occupied by Middlesbrough, Southampton, Leicester and Brighton assumed heroic scale. All clubs in the 20,000-40,000 bracket are now scrambling for other ways to compete with rivals bringing in two or three times their gate receipts. Player sales make up much of the difference. Happily, Bournemouth started the week third in the Premier League table with an 11,307 capacity.

Now, even adequate big grounds are considered anachronistic. It's forever champagne o'clock for lawyers, developers, builders and architects. But before we grow too smug about the UK's arenas, fan surveys say the actual football and tradition are still more important than architecture. Popularity polls tend to nominate Barcelona, Real Madrid, AC/Inter Milan, Bayern Munich and Liverpool as the top five.

If the football boom ever ends, and these super-grounds struggle (like British pubs increasingly) to get people in, there will be a lot of half-empty real estate out there - palaces, that could perhaps serve as climate disaster havens, like the New Orleans Superdome after Hurricane Katrina.

For now, the construction mania is itself a good spectator sport. It will leave a replica urban American landscape across Europe. The stadiums shrink the average spectator to a dot and create vast human flows onto transport networks.

We talk all the time about the inflationary traffic of players between the richest clubs. Those big names will come and go. But the stunning architecture of the 21st century TV rights and speculator bonanza will remain. Enjoy - and good luck getting home.

# Today's Visitors - Leiston FC - Club History TOT FOOTBALL

Leiston Town Football Club were first established in 1880 and at the time were undoubtedly closely associated with the striving Richard Garrett Engineering Works based in the town. The club joined the North Suffolk League in the early 1890's and games were played on the old Recreation Ground adjacent to Gas Hill (now known as Park Hill) and players would change either at the White Horse Hotel or at the Works Hall. At the turn of the century

the club competed in the FA Amateur Cup and after the First World War made their FA Cup debut.

The club has competed in nine League competitions in their history namely North Suffolk, Suffolk & Ipswich (Ipswich & District), Southeast Anglian, East Anglian, Essex & Suffolk Border, Norfolk and Suffolk, Eastern Counties, Isthmian and Southern.

After the First World War Richard Garrett's bought the land off Victory Road, providing a sports area and clubhouse for the local community naming it the Leiston Works Athletic Association in 1921 and this has been the home for the Football Club for over 100 years although the ground name was changed in the 1980's to LTAA (Leiston Town Athletics Association) following the closure of the Garrett's Works.

The club has been playing at Step 3 for thirteen seasons, making the end of season play off's twice and for the new season will have Chris Wigger at the helm as First Team Manager. The Reserves currently play at Step 6 and have done so since 2014. The Youth side (Under 18) are part of the Eastern Counties set up while the striving boys and girls Youth sections compete in the Eastern Junior Alliance and South Suffolk Youth Leagues.

Leiston Town were 'full members' of the Football Association from the early 1950's until 1982 during which time the club received the 'Illuminated Address' from the Football Association to celebrate the club's centenary. In the mid 1980's the club dropped the Town part to become just Leiston FC, but the club regained its Full Membership with the FA in 2020 after a few years as Associate Members. Leiston Youth side were the first club in Suffolk to enter the FA Youth Challenge Cup reaching the First Round and a trip to Highbury to face Arsenal in 1954. Later this century the club first entered the FA Vase in 1987 before first entering the FA Trophy in 2011. Leiston have appeared in 34 Suffolk FA County cups (Senior) and have won the Premier Cup (2), Senior Cup (1), Junior Cup (4) and Charity Cup (4). In the last 20 odd years, as well as League titles, they have also won the Jewson League Division One KO Trophy and the East Anglian Cup.

#### The Record against Leiston

Sporting have played Leiston nine times, all in the Southern League Premier Division Central. These matches include Sporting's record win and defeat at this level.

Back in season 2019/20 on 2nd November, Sporting visited Victory Road and came away with an 8 - 0 win. Hat-tricks from Greg Mills and Mikey Taylor were seen by a crowd of 148.

Since then, Leiston have pretty much had the advantage and in season 2022/23 on 15th October, they ran out 7 - 1 winners at the Victoria Ground watched by 618 spectators. The record between the two clubs is as follows:

The last match played was on 18th January earlier this year at the UK Electriacl Stadium when Leiston won 1 - 0. The only goal coming from Kyran Clements on the 90th minute with 725 fans in attendance.

There is no record of Bromsgrove Rovers having played Leiston.

The Non-League Paper provides a column for club programmes each week. This week's contribution is from Jon Couch.

THE week leading up to Halloween proved to be something of a horror show for Non-League bosses everywhere as the managerial merry-go-round clicked into overdrive. As a result, it caused endless nightmares for us at NLP Towers as the news pages had to be constantly updated and, in the case of John Coleman's Friday afternoon arrival at Aldershot Town, ripped up and rewritten completely.

We were perhaps given a sign of what was to come when Kettering Town announced the departure of Simon Hollyhead just minutes after their 4-0 defeat at Redditch United on Saturday with the former assistant at Champions League side Malmö having resigned from his Poppies' post at two days previous.

It's fair to say it wasn't a good week for Isthmian League bosses with a high percentage of departures coming in and around the M25.

Club legend Drew Cooney left East Grinstead Town after four years in charge. Cooney made over 500 appearances for the Wasps before taking over the hotseat in 2021. He quit after picking up just one win from his opening 11 games in charge of the Isthmian Southeast club.

League rivals Hastings United also made a change with former Whitehawk boss David Altendorff replacing Lee Carey in the U's hotseat, while former England manager Peter Taylor stood down at Isthmian North side Canvey Island after five months in charge following the Gulls' midweek defeat to Benfleet in the Essex Senior Cup.

Tilbury too have new joint-bosses with George Christou and Jack Toghli coming in for Marc Harrison and Liam Wallace, who left the Dockers by mutual consent.

It was all change also at Lewes after it was announced that popular former boss Craig Nelson had returned to the Dripping Pan hotseat after six months away, replacing Bradley Pritchard. Nelson steered the Rooks to their best league start in over a decade last season before being snapped up by Tonbridge Angels.

There's no busier owner in English football right now than Bracknell Town's Kayne Steinborn-Busse. He is looking for his FIFTH manager in the space of just 17 league games after dispensing with former Wealdstone and Notts County assistant Matt Saunders. Saunders had just one point and an FA Cup win over Tadley Calleva to show for his seven games in charge of the Robins - a tenure which will be remembered for releasing the club's two longest serving players after questioning the commitment of the senior members of the squad.

Perhaps the highest profile departure last week was that of Altrincham chief Phil Parkinson after eight years at Moss Lane. The 44-year-old led the Robins to two promotions in three seasons, from the NPL Premier to the National League, and then a play-off campaign in 2023-24, where they finished fourth before falling to Bromley in the semi-finals. However, after losing a plethora of key players in the summer, including the likes of Regan Linney, Justin Amaluzor and Alex Newby, the Robins have struggled to find the same consistency this season and Parkinson leaves after a seven-match unbeaten league run.

Altrincham will now be looking to appoint a new man in charge, much like league rivals Aldershot Town, who brought in John Coleman to replace Tommy Widdrington, who left a fortnight ago, and has since rejoined Eastbourne Borough. Harsh perhaps on Alan Dowson, who took interim charge of team affairs for Saturday's trip to Scunthorpe and told The NLP of his desire to make the most of his opportunity in the Shots hotseat. Dowson, the former Woking, Hampton & Richmond Borough and Kingstonian boss, has now left the EBB Stadium and looking for his next challenge.

At Step 5, Richard Brodie left Glossop North End after two years in charge of Northwest Counties League side and is now back playing with former club Skelmersdale United at the age of 38.

Dan Bailey quit as player/manager and coach of Combined Counties Premier North strugglers Virginia Water, Mark Scott resigned from Southwest Peninsula Premier East side Axminster Town after a 12th successive defeat and Clay Cross Town's management team of Ian Cotton, his assistant Ian Birtley and player/coach Kieran Coupe joined United Counties Premier North rivals AFC Mansfield.

Front man Beresford then left United to re-join Clevedon in September and returned to the day job, adding two goals in ten games to his previous Clevedon tally of 46 in 85.

But the striker was soon back in unfamiliar(ish) territory a week recently when the Western League leaders took on Wellington.

Goalkeeper Jacob Glover was forced to leave the field after only 18 minutes of his Seasiders debut when he injured his shoulder trying to prevent Wellington scoring.

Beresford took the gloves and pulled off a string of fine saves to keep the visitors at bay earning him man of the match honours.

Beresford's heroics went on to help secure the Seasiders a 3-1 win, but managers Nic Steadman and Jamie Smith will be banking on him to score the goals, rather than keep them out!
