

From The Archives, 4 Years Ago

<u>Tuesday 9th November 2021 - 7:45 p.m. kick-off, The Southern League Premier Division Central</u>

Bromsgrove Sporting (0)1 Tamworth (1)1 at the Victoria Ground

Bromsgrove Sporting's interim management team made it four matches unbeaten on Tuesday evening, courtesy of a 1-1 draw with Tamworth at the Victoria Ground.

Jack Thomas put the visitors into the lead with a rather fortuitous effort after 16 minutes before Connor Taylor levelled proceedings 10 minutes into the second half.

Aaron Forde had an early effort sail wide for Tamworth, before Thomas broke the deadlock. From the left wing, he put what appeared to be a troublesome cross into the box that eventually looped over goalkeeper Akos Onodi and into the top corner.

Sporting's first chance of the half came just after the 30-minute mark, as a Demetri Brown cross was volleyed narrowly wide by Jourdain Masidi from just inside the area.

Former Rousler Shaquille McDonald had an opportunity moment later but could only strike wide from range.

Ryan Beswick sent a free kick from a promising position over the bar early in the second half, before Taylor bagged the leveller.

Some exquisite work out wide by new addition and substitute Jamie Molyneux allowed him to find Taylor, who tapped in from inside the six-yard box.

Sporting enjoyed plenty of pressure after the goal, with Tamworth stopper Jas Singh having to be alert to two good chances. Firstly, Jake Bloomer had a well struck shot from 30 yards saved low. Then, Molyneux produced a header that was brilliantly tipped over the bar.

Tamworth substitute Charlie saw his instinctively struck effort fly just over the top of the goal from the edge of the area in the 81st minute.


Molyneux and Masidi both had headed efforts that were off target as the game entered its final stages. Up the other end, in the third minute of additional time, another Tamworth substitute, Alex Jones, attempted an acrobatic effort from six yards out that missed the goal.





Today's Mascots Bromsgrove Sporting Colts U11 JN

Rovers' historians Michael Tovey and Graham Reynolds continue their journey through 140 years of Bromsgrove football, choosing their player of the decade for the 1910s

The 1910s were really a desperate time for the Rovers. Obviously, in the second half of the decade there was no football due to the unimaginable horrors of the First World War, but if we just look at the performance of the side before war broke out, the facts do not lie. The best finish that could be managed was 10th place in the Birmingham Combination in 1911/12. The season before, in 1910/11, they missed out on having to apply for re-election on goal average. Basically, at the end of each season, the bottom three sides in the Combination wouldn't, in a sense, be relegated, but instead would need to be voted back into the League if they were to compete in it the following season. The vote would take play at the Combination's AGM with the number of teams in the vote varying from season to season depending on how many new applications the League had received. Unfortunately, in 1912/13 and 1913/14, both seasons did end up with the club having to apply for re-election. But worst of all was the 1914/15 season, where they finished rock bottom of the Combination. You do wonder if football had not been suspended due to the war, whether Rovers' peers might have lost patience after three re-election applications in consecutive years and kicked them out of the League. Although it was not a great time for the long-suffering fans who frequented the Victoria Ground, there were a number of fine servants of the club in the 1910s. Jerry Bridgwater clocked up 87 appearances over 12 years, predominantly in the back line. J. Miller (one of four

Miller (one of four brothers to represent the Rovers) and A. Nicholls were consistent half backs with 84 and 70 appearances respectively, whilst Bert Satchwell became the latest member of the '100 Club', making 103 appearances between 1908 and 1924.

There were also some players who played for the Rovers in this decade and then went on to

make their mark in the professional game. Billy Barrett was Rovers left-back in the 1911/12 season, before leaving for Nuneaton Town. After the war, he played over 140 games in the Football League with Leicester City. Arthur Cashmore, a centre-forward for Rovers in the 1912/13 season, joined Manchester United in 1913 after a brief spell at Stourbridge. He played three games for the Red Devils before moving on to Oldham Athletic. After the war, he continued his Football League career at Cardiff City and Notts County. Cashmore had arrived at the Rovers from Sparkhill Avondale in November, initially on trial, and whilst never a prolific scorer, his performances started to get noticed by Football League sides and before long scouts were down the Victoria Ground watching him. Towards the end of March, he transferred to Stourbridge and then, just one month later, Manchester United signed him. Whatever financial benefits Stourbridge got from this deal, the Rovers were right to feel aggrieved, their discovery pinched and profited on by someone else. Finally, Hubert Bourne was a forward for Rovers in the ill-fated 1914/15 campaign, where they finished bottom of the Combination. He joined Aston Villa for the 1919/20 season and made a handful of appearances before a persistent knee injury forced his retirement from the game at the age of 25. He was better known as the trainer for Villa for nearly two decades from 1934 to 1953, whilst he also assisted the England side in the late 1930s and 1940s under Walter Winterbottom.

But, as 'Player of the Decade' for the 1910s we have gone for Harold "Harry" Merrick, who played either centre-forward or inside-right for Rovers between 1910 and 1920.

Harry was born on 29 May 1890, in Moseley. He played for Stourbridge in the Birmingham & District League during the 1909/10 campaign. He had a trial with Worcester City at the start of

the 1910/11 season, but ended up joining Rovers in September 1910, making his debut at

centre-forward in a 5-1 defeat to arch rivals Redditch Town at their Red Lane ground. Although he was in an out of the side that campaign, he still managed an impressive 7 goals in 10 games in a struggling side.


In the 1911/12 season, he was joint leading scorer for the Rovers - alongside Frank Crow - with 10 goals from 25 games. In November, he had a trial with Walsall Reserves, who plied their trade in the Central Alliance League. This was the start of an on-off relationship with Walsall.

It was reported he signed for Walsall at the start of the 1912/13 season, but he continued to turn out for the Rovers, where he was, in fact, captain for much of the campaign. He was again top scorer, with 11 goals from 29 games. He netted his only hat-trick for the club this season, in an opening day 3-3 draw against Dudley Phoenix at the Victoria Ground.

The 1913/14 season saw him end up as Rovers leading scorer for the third consecutive season, bagging 13 goals from 21 games, this despite leaving the club in February, to play for Walsall Reserves.

Ahead of the 1914/15 campaign he moved to Nuneaton Town. That season they captured the Birmingham Combination title and, as usual, Harry was his club's leading scorer. The Great War robbed Harry of much of the prime of his career and during the conflict he served as an Able Seaman in the Royal Navy.

When football recommenced in the 1919/20 season, he rejoined Nuneaton but returned to the Rovers in February 1920. Even though he only featured in 10 games, he was once more joint leading scorer - with Payne - netting 5 goals. The fact that the club's leading scorers only scored five goals says it all really. The break from football hadn't changed the Rovers' fortunes and it




He played in the first three games of 1920/21, before leaving the Rovers for the final time, moving to Atherstone Town.

Harry was the father of legendary Birmingham City and England goalkeeper and 1960s/1970s Bromsgrove Rovers manager, Gil Merrick, and the grandfather of 1970s Rovers forward, Neil Merrick. He took a keen interest in both their careers and would have been a frequent visitor to the Victoria Ground well into his eighties. Away from football, he worked as a sheet metal engineer. He passed away in 1977. Here he is (left) pictured in his later years.

Today's Visitors - Royston Town - Club History



Records show that the club came into existence in 1875 making Royston the third oldest club in Hertfordshire after Hitchin and Bishop's Stortford.

The club's first notable achievement occurred during the 1911/12 season when they won the Creake Charity Shield by defeating Wisbech 1-0 in extra time. In more recent times, Royston achieved significant success when they were

promoted to the Herts County Premier League during the 1969/70 season. Subsequently, they became champions in 1972/73 and 1976/77. The team rejoined the South Midlands League in 1978 and secured the Division One title immediately. The club's success continued with appearances in the Herts Charity Shield final in 1979 and as runners-up in the South Midlands League Premier Division in 1980. The Herts Charity Shield was won in 1981/82, and two years later, Royston joined the Isthmian League Division Two North, remaining there for a decade before returning to the South Midlands League in 1994.

After facing a challenging period that led to relegation from the South Midlands League Premier Division at the end of the 2006/07 season, Paul Attfield was appointed as the manager, with Tony Galvin returning as the 1st Team Coach in November 2007.

Under Paul's leadership, the team underwent significant changes, and a 17-game unbeaten streak propelled them from the bottom of the table to a commendable 5th-place finish in the League. This set the foundation for the successful 2008/09 season, where they secured the South Midlands Division One League title with impressive stats: W33, D4, L3, GF138, GA30, GD+108, PTS 103.

The 2011/2012 season marked a pivotal moment in the club's history when they clinched the South Midlands Premier Division title, earning promotion to Step 4 in the form of the Evo-Stik Southern League Division One Central.

In their first season back at Step 4 after 19 years, Royston exceeded expectations, consistently performing well and even contending for a playoff spot. However, a last-minute equaliser in the final game dashed their hopes. The following season also saw them reach the playoffs, but the team faced challenges after Paul Attfield's resignation due to ill health. Steve Castle was appointed Manager in December 2013, and the team continued to strive for success, ultimately earning promotion to the Southern League Premier Division, marking the highest level of play in the club's 142-year history.

Seasons 2017/18 and 2018/19 were characterised by solid performances, finishing 7th and 9th respectively in the Premier Division Central. The 2019/20 season proved to be one of the most successful and thrilling in the club's history, with remarkable performances in both the FA Cup and FA Trophy. The team's standout performance in the FA Trophy brought immense pride, especially with victories against higher-ranked teams, although the Concord Rangers quarter-final tie ended in disappointment. Despite strong contention for the league title, the Covid-19 pandemic forced the nullification of the season, leading to bitter disappointment.

Season 2021/22 resulted in an eighth place in the league following an inconsistent league campaign. Performances in FA competitions were disappointing, beaten at Garden Walk by Step 4 Mildenhall Town and exiting the FA Trophy early, beaten by Kingstonian in a penalty shoot-out. The highlight of the season was wining the Southern League Challenge Cup, beating the Southern League Premier (South) champions Taunton Town 7-0 on aggregate.

In season 2022/23 injuries to key players and poor away form in the league ended with a 13th place finish in the table. In the FA Cup and Trophy Royston Town were defeated at the second hurdle, by Hemel Hempstead and Heybridge Swifts respectively.

Season 2023/24 saw Chris Watters take over as manager, mixed form resulted in a mid-table finish, with early exits in the FA Cup and FA Trophy.

We finished **last season** in a mid-table position in the league after slipping away towards the end of the season when drawing eight of our last twelve games. We performed better in the FA competitions, falling at the third hurdle both in the FA Trophy and FA Cup, losing to higher-league opposition in both cases.

Royston Town - Profiles

Jamie Head (Goalkeeper)

Joined us last season on a dual-registration basis with St Albans City before signing on for us as our Number 1 this season. Jamie's previous clubs include Berkhamsted, Cambridge City, Dunstable Town and AFC Dunstable.

Reuben Rabstein (Goalkeeper)

Joined the Crows in season 2023/24 from New Salamis FC. Reuben's other previous clubs include Wingate & Finchley and Maccabi London Lions.

Adam Murray (Defender)

Team captain, who can play as a central defender or striker, joined us at the beginning of season 2017/18, having spent the previous two seasons at Cambridge City where he made 60 appearances. Given the different positions that Adam has played, he has amassed an impressive haul of 70+ goals in around 300 appearances for the Crows.

James Brighton (Defender)

Experienced full-back who joined us in November 2019 from Kettering Town, where he had spent a successful four seasons. James has previously played for Hemel Hempstead Town, Cambridge City & Cambridge United.

Archie Locke (Defender)

Young defender who joined us from Harpenden Town last season and quickly made a good impression, Archie previously played for Hoddesdon Town & Hertford Town.

Ed Asafu-Adjaye (Defender)

Re-joined the Crows in 2019 after spending a season at Hayes & Yeading, Ed started his playing career at Luton Town and broke into the 1st team during the 2008/9 season. In total he made 64 appearances for The Hatters before moving to Forest Green Rovers and then to Hemel Hempstead Town, Ed is a versatile defender who can play anywhere across the back line.

Luke Warner-Eley (Defender)

Rejoined the Crows towards the end of last season from Bishop's Stortford, Luke was previously with us in season 2019/20. His other clubs include Peterborough Sports, Billericay Town and St Albans City.

Anton Matthews (Defender)

Signed for the Crows for the start of this season, Anton is a commanding defender who was with Witham Town last season.

Jesse Akubuine (Midfield)

Started his career at Brentford before moving to Queen of the South in 2017. After 2 years North of the border Jesse joined AFC Rushden & Diamonds before spells with Stratford Town, Bedford Town and Waltham Abbey. Joined the Crows at the start of last season.

Harvey Beckett (Midfield)

Signed in July 2024 following his release by Cambridge United. Whilst at The Abbey he spent time on loan at St Neots Town, Concord Rangers and a successful spell with the Crows at the start of the 23/24 campaign.

Josh Boorn (Midfield)

Joined us at the start of this season after being at Bracknell Town last season, a former Luton Town academy graduate, Josh has also played for Kings Langley, Marlow and Chalfont St Peter.

Will St Clair-Burton (Midfield)

Midfielder who joined us on a dual-registration basis from Chesham United at the end of October, Will joined Chesham last season from Aylesbury United and was previously with the MK Dons Academy.

Freddie Price (Midfield)

Attacking midfielder who joined us for the start of this season, Freddie was with Bowers & Pitsea last season. and previously had spells with Chatham Town and Concord Rangers.

Thomas Avgoustidis (Midfield)

Joined us at the start of this season from Leyton Orient, where he was part of their academy. Whilst with the O's Thomas spent time on loan at New Salamis, Cheshunt, Hornchurch and Potters Bar Town.

Jack Newall gave Sporting the lead on 39 minutes, but Archie Locke and Harvey Bennet grabbed the winners for Royston on the 51st and 60th minutes respectively. 394 spectators saw the game and Reece King was made Sporting Player of the Match.

There is no record of Bromsgrove Rovers having played a Royston team.

IN a funny way, Kevin Horlock's quote after Maldon & Tiptree's defeat to Port Vale encapsulated what the FA Cup is all about.

"We had them on the ropes for five minutes - we probably scored 85 minutes too soon," the Jammers boss said of Anisius Lewis' very early strike that put the Step 4 side ahead, "but what a magical moment."

Less than 20 minutes later and Horlock's side were 4-1 down to the League One Valiants, the lowest-ranked team in the first round's FA Cup adventure was coming to an end.

But it's those moments that make the FA Cup. For a few minutes, nine to be more precise, their travelling fans would have been wondering 'what if'.

We all know about the financial rewards that comes with the FA Cup - the TV cash to boost the coffers, the benefit of prize money, extra sponsorship and ticket sales. But, also, it gives unforgettable moments.

Think of Havant & Waterlooville all those years ago when they led the mighty Liverpool not once but twice at Anfield. Think of Kidderminster Harriers taking West Ham to the final moments before Declan Rice bailed the Premier League side out.

Think of Tamworth last season as they took Tottenham into extra-time but almost won it in the dying stages of the 90 minutes.

At the weekend Chelmsford City caused the first upset of round one when they beat Braintree Town at Saturday lunchtime - a feat repeated by fellow Step 2 sides Weston-super-Mare, who knocked out Aldershot Town, and Slough Town as they piled the woe on Altrincham.

There were some all Non-League ties that brought Sutton United, Wealdstone and Buxton success and a place in the second round.

We also saw Gateshead upset League One AFC Wimbledon, Brackley Town beat Notts County on penalties and Boreham Wood take, what feels like, their annual EFL scalp in Crawley Town.

Carlisle United looked to be on their way out at Reading before Regan Linney scored two stoppagetime goals to force extra-time - where he then scored the winner to complete his hat-trick.

"It was a good three points," he accidentally said live on Match of the Day the next day. "I've crumbled here!" Thankfully the striker doesn't crumble when he's in the box!

"Where's the matchball?" presenter Jason Mohammad asked. "It's still in my car," Linney responded with a smile. That's the magic of the FA Cup!
