From The Archives, 14 Years Ago

The Althium Midland Combination Division One - Monday 26th December 2011

11:30 a.m. kick-off

Bromsgrove Sporting 4 (3) Fairfield Villa 1 (0)

A bumper crowd of over 500 turned up at the Victoria Ground on Boxing Day to witness an entertaining match that gave Bromsgrove Sporting bragging rights over local rivals Fairfield Villa.

Villa had won the only previous encounter between these two teams in a cup match earlier in the season, so revenge was high on the agenda for the home team.

Sporting took the field with new right-back Karl Fellows and former Villa 'keeper Tom Savage between the sticks whilst Martin Keight lined up for Fairfield having played at Bromsgrove earlier in the season. There was also a warm welcome for former Rover Steve Frost now plying his trade in the back four for Fairfield.

Unfortunately for Steve it was not an auspicious start as he gave Sporting the lead on six minutes when he put the ball into his own net. Kevin Banner doubled the lead on 20 minutes with well-taken effort from twenty yards out, whilst the impressive Jon Rogers gave Sporting a three nil against his former club when he struck on the 24th minute.

Although Sporting had dominated the first half, they had not had it completely their own way and after the interval, Villa pushed hard to get back into the game and gave themselves a lifeline when substitute Nick O'Connell got one back on 57 minutes but that was cancelled out when Jon Rogers scored his second nine minutes later that effectively put the game beyond Fairfield's reach.

With both defences putting up pretty solid barriers, chances were few and far between for the last twenty minutes and with a number of tired legs on a soft pitch there was some relief when Mr Rodway blew his whistle to confirm the three points for Sporting.

So, disappointment for Fairfield who were hoping to build on their win against league leaders Blackwood the week before. For Bromsgrove the first points in the three games and a more solid looking performance.

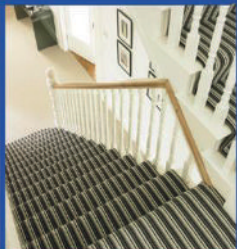
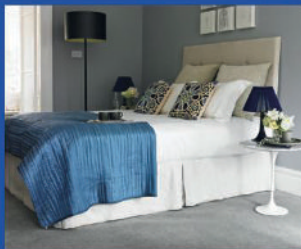

Rovers' historians Michael Tovey and Graham Reynolds continue their journey through 140 years of Bromsgrove football, choosing their player of the decade for the 1930s



The 1930s was, by and large, a hard slog for the Rovers. The decade began with a couple of bottom half finishes in the Birmingham Combination before finishing rock bottom in the 1932/33 season, which resulted in them once more having to go cap in hand to their peers in the re-election ballot. However, 1933/34 saw a change in fortunes. Fuelled by the goal scoring exploits of Sammy Small, they reached the heady heights of 4th, their highest league finish since the 1904/05 season. A 7th placed finish followed, but then it was back to the constant battle of trying to avoid having to apply for re-election. Off the pitch, 1937 saw the opening of new dressing rooms, ending the long-standing arrangement of players and officials changing at the club's headquarters, the Roebuck Inn, and walking up the road to the Victoria Ground. On the pitch things remained gloomy. Yet again, they had to apply for re-election in the 1938/39 season, although history repeated itself with a re-election season being followed by a decent campaign. The outbreak of the Second World War saw the Birmingham Combination reduced to ten teams, with Rovers finishing in a creditable 4th place, having headed the table at Christmas. Had they not lost David Massart, who scored eleven goals in nine appearances and who forged a lethal front three alongside Johnny Gill and Ernie Waldron, to Army Service, they most likely would have been challenging for the title. Due to a ruling where Combination teams didn't have to register

players, a number of League players turned out for the club this season, including Massart, Charlie Craven (both Birmingham), Dick Pike (WBA), and Tom Brawley (Stoke City). The decade ended on a high when the Rovers lifted the Tillotson Cup - a cup competition introduced for Combination clubs to pad out the fixture list due to the reduced league - with a thrilling 4-3 victory over Stourbridge, courtesy of a last-minute goal from Ernie Waldron. This was the first trophy the club had won since they triumphed in the Chatrian Cup back in 1897!

Although not being the finest of decades for the Rovers there were, as always, some stalwarts who deserve a mention. Wally Heath was a fine keeper who was 'number one' for four seasons, making over 130 appearances between 1933 and 1937. David Rees and Raymond Stanley were reliable right-backs with 88 and 74 appearances respectively, while Frank Davis notched up 85 games at left-back. In the half-back line, Ernie Saunders and Jack Scott both just fell short of joining "the 100 club" and Catshill's Frank Harris was a 'hard as nails' former Cardiff City and Charlton Athletic player, who almost certainly would have played more than his 50 games were it not for the war intervening. He would later go on to become Manager of the Rovers. Up front, Fred Dipple was a Bromsgrove lad who gave great service at outside-right between 1929 and 1939, clocking up over 170 appearances. Ernie Waldron's star shone very brightly at inside-left for two seasons in the early thirties before he was snapped up by Crystal Palace. He returned to the Rovers for the war affected 1939/40 season. Norman Lacey was a prolific centre forward in the latter half of the decade, achieving the amazing feat of scoring more goals than he made appearances, 84 goals from 83 games. But despite Norman's scoring

prowess, the player we have chosen as our 'Player of the Decade' for the 1930s is John "Jack" Simons.

Born in Redditch on 27 November 1911, Jack played for Hinckley United from 1931 up until he joined Rovers at the start of the 1933/34 season. He made his debut at right-half in the first game of the season, a comprehensive 4-0 victory over Leamington, and was soon one of the first names on the team sheet. He was sometimes captain during what was an unusually successful season for the Rovers, where Sammy Small bagged an incredible 40 goals in just 26 games before joining Birmingham in March 1934. Surprisingly, when Sammy moved on they didn't miss his goals as much as you might have thought, as Jack moved up to the forward line and took over his prolific scoring mantle, with 15 goals in 9 games, including hat-tricks in two consecutive matches at the Victoria Ground over the Easter period against Birmingham Trams and Redditch Town, propelling Rovers to a 4th placed finish.

In the 1934/35 season, Jack was captain of the side and ever present, in what was another reasonable season where the Rovers finished in the top half of the table. His value to the side was immense as he could literally play anywhere on the park. He started that campaign in the half-back line but was again shifted to centre forward where he repeated the feat of scoring a hat-trick in consecutive games at the Victoria Ground, this time against Evesham Town and Cheltenham Town. He obviously relished a local derby against Redditch, as he bagged all four goals in a 4-2 Boxing Day victory at Red Lane in front of 2,500 spectators. Despite being a reliable goal getter, in the New Year it was decided he would serve the team better in defence, where he performed admirably at right-back for the rest of the season.

The next four seasons saw Jack continue as captain. He was largely used in either the back or the half-back line, with occasional appearances up front. But his importance to the side can't be underestimated and can be summed up with a comment from the *Bromsgrove Messenger* in April 1937, "Simons was still away from the Rovers team owing to his shoulder injury sustained against Redditch, and that, someone remarked, meant the Rovers only had half a team on the field." It was during this 1936/37 season that his brother, Frederick, made his only

appearance for the club, getting on the scoresheet as a scratch looking Rovers' side lost 5-2 to Evesham Town.

The esteem he was held in was made clear by the fact, that before a match with Birmingham 'A' in September 1938, he was presented with a wedding gift of a clock, complete with a suitable inscription from the club and its fans. Jack is pictured here on his wedding day in Bromsgrove along with his bride, Hilda Bridgland.

In January 1939, Jack clocked up his 200th appearances for the club, becoming the fourth man to achieve this feat, but his time at the Rovers was coming to an end. In March 1939, for reasons unknown, he declared himself unavailable to play for the club. It was hoped he would reverse his decision for the 1939/40 season, but it was not to be, and his distinguished six-year Rovers career was over, his last appearance coming in a 6-0 defeat by Nuneaton Borough on 4 March 1939. Jack deserves to be remembered as a true Rovers' great and certainly one of




















the finest utility players to have graced the Victoria Ground.

Away from football he worked as a warehouse man. He passed away in July 1983, aged 71.

FORTY-FOUR years on from his debut TV appearance on a BBC1 news report, Tony Incenzo is closing in on fulfilling a lifetime dream.

As a fresh-faced Queens Park Rangers superfan, it was a trip to local club Hendon which ignited the teenager's love for the Non-League game.

Fast forward four decades and Tony's fire burns fiercer than ever and a quite incredible feat draws near.

Tony's teenage dream to watch a match at every Non-League ground in the country is now incredibly just SIX visits away from being completed – and 2026 is finally the year he intends to fulfil it.

With grounds on all four corners of the UK (and even beyond) all ticked off, the ultimate groundhopper – a bi-weekly columnist for The NLP - can now look forward to trip to Blyth Town, Elburton Villa, Ilminster Town, Fulwood Amateurs, Sunderland West End and Albion Sports/Route One Rovers (groundshare) to complete the card.

Tony's aim is to visit all six grounds by April – at least until the promoted sides from Step 7 enter the National League System to add a few more to the tally. It really is a never-ending feat.

Last month, Tony completed another page of his giant logbook where he has handwritten details of every one of the 5,780 football matches, he has attended since his first admission in 1971.

In this week's NLP, in the shops, and online, as usual this Sunday, Tony looks back on a myriad of amazing adventures watching 70 Non-League matches throughout 2025.

Having travelled from Dublin, down to Cornwall and all the way up to Northumberland, Tony reveals his top 10 highlights for the second half of 2025 in date order to follow on from his NLP column from May.

Tony tells of his visit to his native Ireland to watch the FA of Ireland Cup, the last Cornish ground off his checklist and a trip to the Fylde Coast in the Isuzu FA Vase with a vociferous welcome. He also took in the UK's first private football academy and a Midland Football League match abandoned in the first half due to high winds.

And find out also how Steven Gerrard managed a name check on his travels.

In 2026, The NLP will be there every step of the way as Tony looks to chalk off his last remaining six grounds, while the ever-popular Diary of a Groundhopper and our Hopping Poet, Chris Towers, will continue to give their own individual takes on the life of a Non-League football fan. Like Tony and the rest, we're Hopping Mad for the Non-League and remain committed to bringing you unrivalled coverage again in 2026. Merry Christmas to you all.

Today's Visitors - Redditch United FC - Club History



1891

The Reds are one of the longest established football clubs in the Midlands, starting out as Redditch Town in the Birmingham Combination League in 1891

1893

The club's debut campaign in 1893/94 began in the 1st Qualifying Round with a 4-1 win at home against Singers FC who five years later would change their name to Coventry City. However, Redditch Town withdrew before facing Hednesford (Town) in the

2nd Qualifying Round, a pattern repeated the following season with victory over Stafford Rangers and withdrawal before facing the original Coalville Town. The reasons for the withdrawals have not been identified, but it wasn't uncommon for clubs in the 19th Century to either struggle to fund an away trip, find enough available players, or have more important competitions to focus on.

1894

Redditch Town were crowned first winners of the Worcestershire Senior Cup in 1894.

1896

Redditch Town not only dropped its suffix at the end of the 1896/97 season but also dropped down to compete in local league football, not stepping back up until joining the Birmingham Combination for the 1908/09 season. This was followed two years later by a return to the FA Cup, but Redditch were well beaten 6-0 by league rivals Willenhall Pickwick in the 1910/11 Extra Preliminary Round. The final few years before the outbreak of World War I would witness just one FA Cup win for Redditch, 1-0 at Willenhall Swifts in the 1914/15 Preliminary Round, but this would lead to the club's heaviest FA Cup defeat of all time, 8-0 at the hands of Cradley Heath St Luke's.

1930

The club prospered in the 1930s and again 20 years later when they were Birmingham Combination champions in 1952 and 1955.

1971

In 1971, United was added to the name and in November of that year, the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in their history. A record crowd of 4,500 rammed into the Valley Stadium to see the Reds draw 1-1 with Division Four side Peterborough United before losing 6-0 in the replay.

1975

The club joined the Southern League and were promoted to the Premier Division at the end of the 1975-76 campaign having scored more than 100 goals in the process.

1977

The current Cedar Road and Town End Stands were erected and opened for the start of the Anglo-Italian Tournament. Redditch United featured in the alongside some giants of Italian Football and hosted Lecco and Cremonese

1979

United were founder members of the Alliance Premier League at the start of the 1979/80 but struggled against the likes of Barnet and Yeovil Town in what would evolve into the Football Conference, now The National League.

1989

The club then plied its trade in the Southern League for more than 20 years the highlight of which was another run to the first round of the FA Cup in 1989 before losing 3-1 to Conference side Merthyr Tydfil in front of another sell-out crowd.

1997

The club made the headlines at the end of the 1997-98 season, playing nine games in nine days due to a backlog of fixtures brought about by the poor weather and the then grass Valley Stadium Pitch.

2003

At the end of the 2003/04 season, the Reds clinched an historic double promotion under the guidance of manager Rod Brown. Having secured the Southern League Western Division, the club then won two play-off matches to secure a place in the newly formed Conference North, where they stayed for seven seasons. The Club entered financial troubles and drop from the National League North in 2011.

2011

The Reds won the Worcestershire Senior Cup and a number of players made the move into full-time football including Jermaine Hylton who joined Swindon Town and Omari Sterling-James who went to Cheltenham Town.

2014

Having just missed out on the play-offs in 2014/15, the club finished runners-up the following year only to lose out to Leamington in the play-offs.

2016

In 2016, the club worked with Redditch Borough Council, the FA and the Football Foundation as a £900,000 investment programme was carried out which saw a state-of-the-art 3G playing surface installed as well as substantial upgrades to changing facilities. The new-look facilities were officially opened by Sports Minister Tracey Crouch.

A full time Academy was developed which enables scholars to take part in College and University level education alongside an elite football programme. Since its formation several players have developed through the pathway to senior football at Redditch United and other local Clubs.

2018

Redditch United Women's Team does the double, as they are crowned League and Cup winners.

2020

Covid-19 pandemic rages through the globe meaning that the 2019/20 season is cut short due to national lockdown and Redditch are saved from near certain relegation. A new season starts later than normal in September 2020 with a new Chairman and Manager. United start strong

under Matt Clarke only for the campaign to be delayed in November and eventually curtailed in February after just 8 games had been played.

2021

United Invest in new classroom facilities and add to their education offer with the formation of a SEND education programme with Heart of Birmingham Vocational College.

2022

Redditch United become the home of England Walking Football Community hosting both their training sessions and international match days. In September the club hosted a Tournament with teams travelling from Northern Ireland, Wales, The Isle of Man and Peru.

In this year the club also suffered the devastating loss of 1st Team player Tom Rankin. A permanent memorial for Tom was unveiled the following season in their League game against Rushden & Diamonds; this is the side that Tom played his last game for United.

2024

Redditch United's turns into the home of fictional team Avon FC for a week as the Valley Stadium becomes the set of BBC series Shakespeare & Hathaway

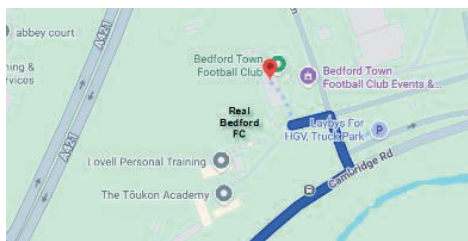
