From The Archives, 10 Years Ago

The Midland Football League Division One - Saturday 13th August 2016, 3:00 p.m. kick-off

Bromsgrove Sporting 3 (2) Southam United 0 (0) at The Victoria Ground

Bromsgrove Sporting's title ambitions got off to the best possible start on Saturday afternoon, as they cruised to a 3-0 victory against Southam United in their first game of the 2016/17 Midland Football League Division One.

New signing Chris Lloyd continued his sparkling start in a Sporting shirt with a beautifully chipped effort on the 40th minute mark before fellow recent acquisition Ahmed Ali scored just before the half time whistle to give the Rouslers a commanding lead heading into the interval.

It was a hat trick for new faces at the Victoria Ground, as talismanic striker Tony Clarke headed home Bromsgrove's third to ensure that they would back up their authoritative performance with all three points on their first league game of the season.

Sporting started the game with real urgency and could have taken the lead inside a minute, as the exciting Lucky Nwosu passed to Robbie Bunn, who just struck wide.

Nwosu caused Southam all sorts of problems in the early stages, as his speed and skill allowed him to beat defenders at will. His cross into the box on six minutes was backheeled towards goal by Clarke but saved by Thomas Bryce, with the follow up chipped effort from Lloyd spectacularly headed off the line.

Clarke had numerous chances inside the next 20 minutes, the best of which being a sumptuous, looping volley that clattered the crossbar off the back of a pinpoint Luke Edwards ball forward.

The next quarter of an hour was slightly frustrating for Sporting, as they dominated play, with Ali and Nathan Walker controlling proceedings expertly in the middle of the park yet had nothing to show for their dominance.

The 39th minute finally saw Bromsgrove break the deadlock, as Lloyd latched onto a delicate lofted ball from the skilful Joe Haines and nonchalantly lobbed the ball over the helpless Bryce in the Southam goal.

A minute before half time saw Ali get a richly deserved goal for his endeavour, as he thumped home from close range, in the midst of a goalmouth scramble that came from Walker's accurate corner.

Southam had very few chances which was testament to Bromsgrove's resilient defence throughout; their best effort on goal being a 50th minute Daniel Brierley free kick that rolled safely into the arms of Chris Jay, on what was a very quiet afternoon for the Sporting stopper.

The game was put beyond any doubt on the hour mark, as Walker's corner taking ability was seen to good effect once again, this time finding the head of Clarke who powerfully guided the ball home, much to the jubilation of the Shed End faithful.

The final fifteen minutes were somewhat quiet, with Haines continuing his fine display with a shot from 20 yards that was comfortably saved and Clarke having a one on one saved after a neat pass from substitute Chrisi Conway the only major highlights.

A comfortable start for Sporting, putting them 2nd, in a game that will be remembered as the first competitive home game since the sad passing of chairman Jon Prescott, who was honoured in an impeccably observed pre-match silence and 69th minute applause, his age when he died.

ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

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The Non-League Paper provides a column for club programmes each week. Here is this week's contribution is from Jon Couch.

LAST week, we received confirmation that new pitch perimeter barrier rules have been introduced by the Football Association for Non-League clubs following its review into ground safety across the National League System.

It means that solid brick, breeze block and concrete barriers around pitches will finally now be a thing of the past at grounds across the country at Steps 1-6.

The FA review was called following the tragic passing of striker Billy Vigar, who died after suffering a significant brain injury following a collision with a perimeter wall while playing for Chichester City against Wingate & Finchley on September 25, 2025. He was just 21 years old.

After Vigar's death, a petition calling for a ban on brick walls around football pitches across the NLS received more than 4,000 signatures.

It came after Bath City's Alex Fletcher suffered a fractured skull after colliding with a concrete advertising hoarding during a match in November 2022.

Six months later, then Sports Minister Stuart Andrew joined forces with the Professional Footballers' Association (PFA) in writing to the FA, Premier League, English Football League and National League, calling on them to adopt a more proactive approach to player safety in this area.

Now, almost four years on, it has taken the most tragic of deaths to spark any kind of action. And even then it took 11 months to deliberate and pass! I mean, what on earth was there to discuss?

I've been openly critical of the Football Association and the relevant authorities for letting this fester for so long,

Still, we got there in the end and at least now Billy Vigar's legacy can go to helping protect and preserve player safety in years to come.

Around 160 football clubs affected by the changes have been informed of the updated regulations and will be required to take appropriate action "within a

reasonable timeframe".

They have been told that all existing barriers that don't meet the criteria must be removed, or at the very least covered or protected.

Financial support will be available to clubs with the FA and the Premier League providing funding through the Premier League Stadium Fund.

In a statement last week, the FA said: "We have undertaken a review of pitch perimeter walls across the National League System and Women's National League to identify what improvements can be made to our Stadium Accreditation Criteria that will help clubs mitigate potential safety risks at their grounds and stadiums.

"As a result of this ongoing phased review, which has been conducted by independent Health and Safety experts, we have updated our Stadium Accreditation Criteria for the 2026/27 season.

"This includes introducing revised criteria relating to pitch perimeter barriers, which no longer permits solid brick, breeze block or concrete barriers around pitches across the National League System for men [Steps 1-6], and the Women's National League [Tiers 3-4].

"Any existing solid brick, breeze block or concrete barriers must be removed as soon as reasonably practicable or covered with suitable protection if they cannot be removed for structural reasons.

"We have informed the clubs at this level that will be required to take action as a result of these changes."

Following last Friday's announcement, a PFA spokesperson said: "Following the tragic death of Billy Vigar last year, we again highlighted these concerns and made clear our view that the lack of progress and leadership on this issue had been unacceptable.

"As part of working groups set up by the FA following Billy's death, we pushed for the FA's Stadium Accreditation criteria to be amended to ban these types of walls so that there is a clear and centralised policy for clubs to follow.

"Given that, it's a welcome step that the FA's regulations have now been changed to reflect that position.

"However, it will now be important for progress on the removal of such walls - and effective mitigation of risks ahead of their removal - to be properly monitored, and for clubs to be given the support they need so that these changes can happen as soon as possible. Player safety must always come first."

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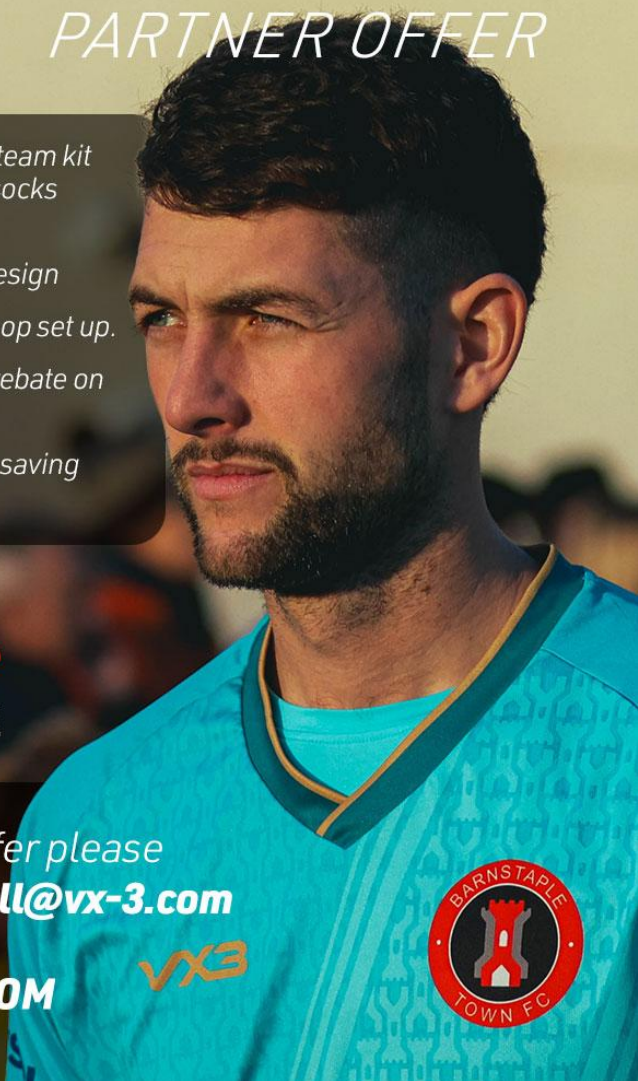
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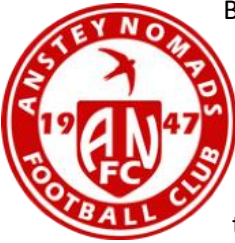


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Our Visitors Today - Anstey Nomads



Before the Second World War two clubs, the St Mary's and the Prims, were playing in Anstey. It was after the war when the boys returned from the services, that the two clubs, Marys and the PM decided to join forces under the name of Anstey Meths and Mary's, which formed in 1946. However, after one season it was decided that the name of the club would be changed to Anstey Nomads.

With the formation of the Nomads football in Anstey took on a higher status, for Leicestershire Senior League Football – the highest grade of amateur football in the county – came to the village.

Early successes in winning the Senior League Division 1 (1951-52 and 1953-54) were followed by heady exploits in the FA Amateur Cup. In their first attempt they reached the first-round proper losing 2-1 at Cambridge. In the second season Gedling Colliery knocked them out in the final qualifying round 2-1 a Gedling. The following season the club wrote a new page in Leicestershire amateur football history, after playing through all five preliminary rounds, their big day arrived when 400 supporters hired a train and made the journey to Gray's in Essex to see the team win 3-1 in the 1st round proper. The 2nd round saw a crowd of 4,500 at Cropston Road with the Nomads losing 2-1 to Hayes. The club then joined the Central Alliance with little or no success. The revamping of Midlands football saw the club in the East Midlands Regional League in 1966-67 and of the six years spent there, top four places were gained in three of them. Back in the Leicestershire Senior League in 1973 and after winning Division Two in their first season the Nomads became one of the powerhouses of local football mainly under the guidance of John Perkins, Willie Wilcox and Denis Moran.

In the Nineties history was created when the Leicestershire Senior Cup and Junior Cup "the double" was achieved in 1994-95. Into the Noughties and 2008-09 was the Nomads most successful season for many a day. Champions of the Leicestershire Senior League and winners of a host of local cups under Stu Deeley. Also gaining promotion to the East Midlands Counties League.

Promoted to the United Counties League, new dressing rooms and a ground overhaul, season 2021/22, with first team, under 21's, 3 x under 18's, women's senior team and a further 34 junior teams together with a walking football side.

In season 2022/23 would see The Nomads promoted to step 4 playing in the Northern Premier League Midlands Division 1. Along the way during this season the club would enjoy a successful FA Cup run within its most recent history reaching

the 4th Qualifying round hosting National League side at the time Chesterfield FC, in front of a crowd of 1500.

After gaining promotion, Anstey Nomads would again begin to create its own history during season 23/24. The highest league the club as ever played in and come the end of the season narrowly missing out on back-to-back promotions in the play-off final. During this season would see the Nomads again have a decent FA Cup run playing the like of Hereford FC along the way.

The 2024/25 season saw Anstey Nomads reach the playoffs for a second consecutive season as they tried to bounce back from the previous season's playoff final heartbreak. Finishing third in the league table saw Nomads host Worcester City, ultimately losing 2-0 on the night to the eventual playoff winners.

2025/26 saw the most successful season in the club's history. A record-breaking run in the FA Trophy saw Nomads reach the Fourth Round, knocking out National League side Hartlepool United 2-1 away from home in the Third Round. In the league Nomads were 11 points behind runaway leaders Carlton Town following a 2-0 home loss to the latter at the start of March. Nomads went on to claim 43 out of a possible 45 points winning 11 games in a row including a 6-1 victory away to Carlton to win the Northern Premier League Midland Division title on the final day of the season. Reaching Step 3 for the first time in the club's history.

In addition to the first team, we now have 57 teams playing under the Nomads banner including Women, Under 18's and Junior sides.
